CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The Citrus Heights Veterans Community Center received welcome news when the owner of an adjacent vacant lot reversed their plans to subdivide the property for new duplexes and agreed to sell the parcel directly to the center.

Michelle Grant, Veterans Community Center president said escrow on the parcel is expected to close by press time. The purchase price was not disclosed, but was considered "satisfactory to both parties," she said and included reimbursement to the property owner for his expenses in developing plans for a

duplex on the site. In February, the Citrus Heights Planning Commission heard a project application by Serhii Shutiak of Tangent

Design and Engineering in Rocklin on behalf of the developer Igor Kolotyuk and the property owner Yuriy Honchar. During the meeting, Grant and other veterans spoke out against the development of duplexes on the lot.

The vacant lot where the two duplex residential units and two auxiliary dwelling units (ADUs) were to be built is regularly used for overflow parking during special events with the consent of the property owner. Parking closest to the building is generally allocated for those veterans and their families with disabilities.

New Self-Serve Recycling Facility Pending Final Certification

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Ivan Pislar and Jacie Leavitt, co-owners and operators of Ivan's Recycling LLC, hope their planned mobile, drop-off, self-serve CRV bag drop recycling kiosk for which they received city planning department approval for and publicly announced last July will open in the Copperwood Square Shopping Center this fall.

The placement of the new kiosk in the Copperwood shopping plaza in Citrus Heights now depends on final certification required by California's Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) which administers the state's overall recycling and waste management program.

"We submitted our application to CalRecycles three

months ago. We have since answered each of their additional financial inquiries as they have asked," Leavitt said. "And we're optimistic that we have finally answered all of their questions just how individual payments to users will be handled," she said.

State certification requires proper accounting procedures and logs for all material accepted and how the payment is made to each customer, she said.

Court Injunction Pauses New Gaming Regulations

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - California cardrooms including Stones Casino in Citrus Heights can continue to legally offer blackjack-style games after a San Francisco Superior Court judge on Thursday, May 21, blocked the enforcement of new state regulations which would have effectively banned them.

Superior Court Judge Richard Darwin issued a preliminary injunction pausing the regulations while a legal challenge from the California Gaming Association (CGA) will continue to proceed through the courts.

Darwin found that Bonta’s Bureau of Gambling Control likely exceeded its legal authority when it adopted sweeping regulations targeting blackjack-style games long operated by California cardrooms.

The decision marks a significant victory for California’s cardroom industry and for cities heavily dependent on gambling tax revenue, including Citrus Heights, Commerce, Hawaiian Gardens and Bell Gardens.

The court’s recent ruling also strengthens the cardrooms’ argument that the Bureau of Gaming Control likely overstepped its authority by effectively rewriting California gaming policy without legislative approval.

The CGA, with support from the California Cardroom Alliance (CCA) and the Communities for California Cardrooms (CCC), had filed two lawsuits in San Francisco Superior Court challenging new regulations issued by the California Department of Justice’s Bureau of Gambling Control, which would eliminate blackjack-style games and significantly restrict player-dealer games that have been legally operated in California cardrooms for decades.

The state Bureau of Gambling Control had ordered card rooms to explain by May 31 how they would comply with new regulations limiting what games could be played.

Citrus Heights has been home to cardrooms since at least the 1950s, and today, Stones Gambling Hall is one of the premier Sacramento-area casinos and gambling halls.

The Stones Gambling Hall

opened in 2014 after its ownership group invested more than \$30 million to transform a largely vacant retail center along Antelope Road into a full-scale, 27,000-square-foot gaming and entertainment venue, operating under one of California’s most tightly regulated gaming models.

Stones employs roughly 300 workers and operates 17 tables, including seven that offer blackjack-style games, according to the company.

Those games are not house-banked. Instead, one player at a time takes on the “player-dealer” role, wagering against others at the table.

Licensed third-party proposition player services — independent companies that supply players to take on the player-dealer role and keep games running — help ensure continuity, with all activity regulated and approved by the state, Stones general counsel Heather Guarena said in a recent interview with the Sacramento Bee.

“The City didn’t take an official position relative to the litigation,” said Marisa Brown, Citrus Heights city communications officer.

City Manager Ashley Feeney provided a legal declaration along with other cities in support of the Petitioner’s motion for a preliminary injunction seeking a stay of the California Bureau of Gaming Control’s (“Bureau”) regulations concerning player dealer games and

blackjack-style games.

“The city of Citrus Heights is especially proud of its strong network of locally owned businesses that create jobs, support community events, and gives the city its unique character,” he stated in his declaration.

“Stones generates positive tax revenues which add to the total revenue in our city’s general fund, and (these funds) are used to provide our residents with essential services, such as important public infrastructure and public safety.”

“Patrons who visit Stones support nearby restaurants, retail stores, and service providers before and after their visits, generating additional customer traffic and revenue for local establishments,” Feeney said.

“Stones also maintains direct business relationships with local vendors, contractors, and service companies, further strengthening the local economy and helping small businesses in Citrus Heights grow and thrive.”

This contributes to the safety and security of the surrounding community.

“Through its partnership with the Citrus Heights Police Department, Stones helps fund the presence of off-duty police officers on-site, which enhances public safety both at the establishment and in the surrounding area,” Feeney said.

“To the extent that the Regulations would reduce Stones’s revenues and require

layoffs, the Regulations would create immediate and severe hardship for our residents who currently work at Stones. That type of sudden unemployment would also place a significant strain on (city) social services,” Feeney said, concluding his declaration.

In February 2026, two sets of California Department of Justice (DOJ) regulations governing cardrooms, one concerning Rotation of the Player-Dealer Position and the other concerning Blackjack-Style games, were approved by the Office of Administrative Law (OAL).

These state regulations were then to take effect on April 1, 2026, but as specified in the regulations, the deadline for cardrooms to submit plans for compliance with the regulations to DOJ was on May 31.

The two rulemaking proceedings, one concerning the rotation of the player-dealer position in California gambling establishments, and the other concerning blackjack-style games, are major regulations that share the same Standardized Regulatory Impact Assessment (SRIA).

Under one of the two new rules, cardrooms could not offer blackjack, the world’s most popular casino card game. Players would no longer “bust” by exceeding 21 points, and cardrooms may not use the name “blackjack” or include the number 21.

In all, there are 88 licensed card rooms in California, the

California Cardroom Alliance said. They offer more than 1,900 tables for various games and employ more than 23,000 people.

Cardrooms argued throughout the legal battle that Bonta’s office was attempting to effectively outlaw games that had long been permitted through prior state approvals and regulatory practices.

The recent case has become one of the most politically explosive gambling disputes in California, pitting wealthy tribal gaming interests against cardrooms, labor unions and local governments dependent on casino tax revenue.

According to a news release from the California Gaming Association (CGA), Superior Court judge Richard Darwin found “clear and convincing evidence” that enforcing the regulations would irreparably harm cardrooms and their communities, CGA said.

Kyle Kirkland, owner of Club One Casino in Fresno and president of the CGA, said the court’s ruling validates the group’s contention that the bureau exceeded its authority by trying to rewrite the state’s gaming laws.

He said the regulations were driven by pressure from “powerful tribal gaming interests” that have long sought to eliminate competition from California cardrooms.

“Cardrooms have lawfully operated the games targeted by these regulations for decades. Our games support thousands of middle-class jobs and generate critical revenue for communities across California. Instead of protecting those communities, Attorney General Bonta chose to advance regulations that threaten local economies, public safety funding, and the livelihoods of thousands of Californians,” Kirkland said.

“Today’s ruling validates what we have said all along: Attorney General Bonta and the Bureau of Gambling Control exceeded their authority by attempting to rewrite California gaming law,” said California Gaming Association President Kyle Kirkland.

“These regulations were driven by pressure from powerful tribal gaming interests that have long sought to eliminate lawful competition from California’s cardrooms,” Kirkland said. ★

at the Planning Commission hearing and decided to pause the project to give us (the Citrus Heights Veterans Community Center) time to purchase the property,” she said.

“He didn’t realize the extent to which the Citrus Heights Veterans Community Center serves the public and its important mission on behalf of local veterans,” she said.

The Citrus Heights Veterans Community Center, located at 6921 Sylvan Road, has since raised approximately \$60,000 in donations towards the purchase of the adjacent property. Ongoing donations to support the cost of the land purchase are continuing.

Grant said she and the board worked closely with Mechanics Bank in Roseville who provided a referral to a private lender which would suit the center’s unique needs as a designated non-profit organization.

“The Citrus Heights Veterans Community Center is a registered historical landmark and a non-profit organization, and it was difficult to find conventional loan funding as income is based on donations from private events,” she said.

Grant said once escrow closes, perimeter fencing will soon be installed around the parcel to better secure it. Some additional physical improvements to the existing parking have been recently made, adding 10 new designated parking

places for disabled veterans or handicapped guests.

“We also moved the shipping containers further back on the property which created additional general parking,” she said.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - "Wish You Were Here" was the theme of the 2026 California State Fair. Despite the heat, many attendees came out to enjoy the traditional "must do" activities at the fair like heading for the hot cinnamon rolls or checking out all the animals and the stage acts.

One popular animal attraction was Wild Things/Conservation Ambassadors which brought an assortment of rescued wild animals to the fair. Visitors got up close with reindeer, kangaroos, lemurs, exotic birds, insects and a couple of snakes.

The non-profit has operated for almost 40 years rescuing confiscated, injured and abandoned wildlife, giving them a home. Some of these animal ambassadors are taken to inner city and other schools educating thousands of kids for a lesson on conservation they wouldn't get anywhere else.

Conservation Ambassadors is not open to the public. Their one-time public appearance at the fair gave them much-needed exposure

as both the visitors and animals come from all over. It also helped with the non-profit expenses. Conservation Ambassadors also has a second facility in Paso Robles.

There were many vendors, service organizations and interactive booths. One has been working hard to inform the public of what is coming to our area as funds are raised. A permanent 95% to scale replica of the Vietnam War Wall is coming to Citrus Heights. It was explained by Project Chairman Scott Miller that the fundraising goal is now \$50 for each of the 58,281 names inscribed on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall in Washington D.C. Bringing a total of \$2.5 million left to raise before being able to break ground in Citrus Heights. They currently have all the building permits and contractors lined up.

The wall can only be 95% to scale as there is a mausoleum on one side and I-80 on the other side. There will be a road surrounding the wall for visitors. Schayltz remembers those being

honored, "For those of us who served, the labor of freedom is different than from those we defended," Schayltz said.

A highlight of the fair was the huge King Tut exhibit which featured 124 exquisitely crafted reproductions of the pharaoh's treasures, including huge golden shrines, jewelry and the famous mask. The original tomb is located in the Valley of the Kings in Egypt.

Throughout the fair there were many opportunities to have fun while learning. For example, there was higher education information available for veterans and fellow attendees. For instance, "Returning Veterans Enlisting their Skills for CAL FIRE Service" (RVETS) offers many careers from aviation to fire fighter to information technology, and "I Can Go to College" offers a myriad of community college

Additionally, Camp Smokey, sponsored by the Firefighters Burn Institute, is a major educational attraction for visitors of all ages. According to their website, visitors can experience a fun, educational and interactive fire safety and prevention exhibit. This exhibit provides information on home fire safety, wildfire safety and more. As well as fun historic knowledge on the traditional Native American uses of fire and fire's role in nature.

The 2027 California State Fair in Sacramento is scheduled for Sept. 17 through Oct. 3, moving from July to early autumn to avoid Sacramento's extreme summer heat and create safer, more manageable working conditions for carnival operators, vendors and agriculture handlers. As a result of the fair taking place during school hours in 2027, teachers will be organizing field trips to the fair for their students to take advantage of all the interactive educational programs and other experiences for students. ★

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - July is National Vehicle Theft Prevention Month, and the California Highway Patrol (CHP) is reminding Californians to protect their vehicles while highlighting encouraging statewide trends. California recorded its second consecutive year of declining vehicle thefts in 2025, as the CHP continued working with local law enforcement agencies to combat organized vehicle theft through targeted enforcement and public awareness.

According to the CHP's 2025

Vehicle Theft Fact Sheet, thieves stole more than 133,000 vehicles statewide in 2025—about 25% fewer than the 176,230 stolen in 2024.

“Vehicle theft is not a victimless crime. It fuels organized criminal activity and creates hardship for families across California. The CHP remains committed to holding offenders accountable, recovering stolen vehicles and working with our law enforcement partners to make our communities safer,” Commissioner Sean Duryee said.

On average, a vehicle was stolen in California about every four minutes in 2025.

Of the 133,372 vehicles stolen statewide last year, 84% were recovered, for a total of 111,661 vehicles. More than half of the recovered vehicles were returned to their owners in drivable condition.

The decline continues a positive trend that began in 2024, when California recorded its first year-over-year decrease in vehicle thefts since 2019. That year, Governor Gavin Newsom deployed CHP officers to work alongside local law enforcement agencies in regional crime suppression operations. Targeted enforcement in Bakersfield, San Bernardino and Oakland helped contribute to reductions

in vehicle thefts and other crime in those communities.

Building on those results, Governor Newsom expanded CHP crime-suppression operations in August 2025 by deploying additional teams to high-crime areas across California.

Several counties where CHP crime suppression teams were deployed also experienced significant declines in vehicle thefts last year. Sacramento county experienced 5,061 vehicle thefts, down 23% from 2024.

Although vehicle thefts continue to decline, motorists remain the first line of defense. The CHP encourages

Californians to reduce their risk by following a few simple safety tips. CHP advises Californians to park in well-lit areas and remove valuables or keep them out of sight. Lock your vehicle every time you leave it, use an alarm system or other anti-theft device. Never leave your vehicle unattended with the engine running and report suspicious activity to law enforcement.

Through strategic enforcement, strong partnerships and public awareness, the CHP remains committed to reducing vehicle theft, disrupting organized criminal networks and keeping California's communities safe. ★

Water Forum Awarded Funding for Lower American River Habitat Enhancement

Federal grants will improve habitat while expanding the science that informs future river management

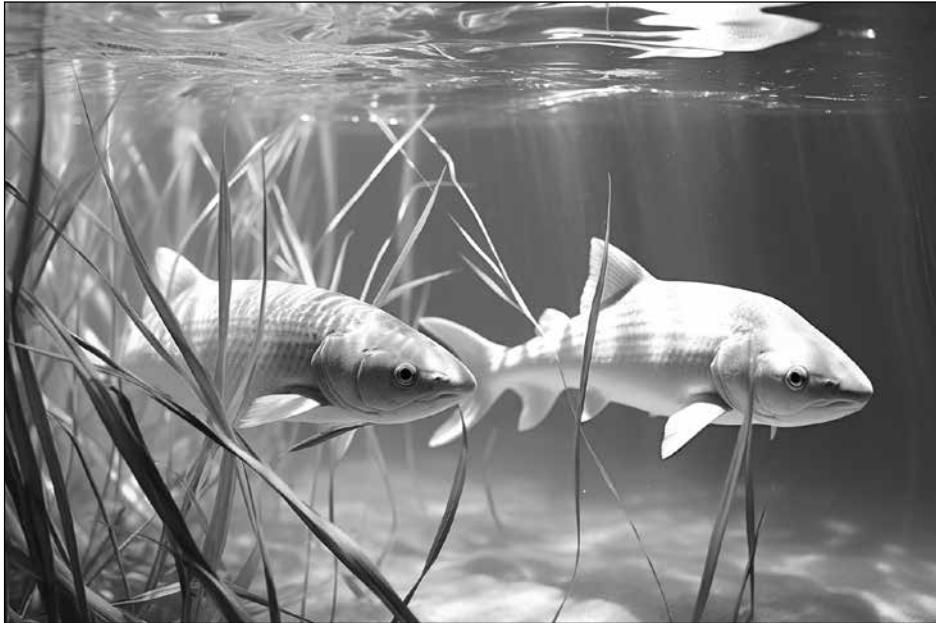

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Water Forum has been awarded more than \$10.6 million in competitive federal funding to enhance habitat for salmon and steelhead in the lower American River while expanding the scientific research and monitoring that help inform future river management decisions.

“The lower American River is one of our region's greatest natural resources,” Executive Director of the Water Forum, Ashlee Casey said. “This funding allows us to continue enhancing habitat for salmon and steelhead while using science to better understand what these fish need to survive and thrive. That knowledge helps us make better decisions that benefit the river, the fish that depend on it and the communities that rely on the river.”

The largest award—\$10 million—will support the long-term maintenance, monitoring and enhancement of habitat enhancement sites that the Water Forum has implemented along the lower American River over the past two decades.

“River habitat isn't static,” Water Forum Habitat and Science Program Manager, Erica Bishop said. “High flows, shifting gravel, vegetation growth and other natural processes continually reshape the lower American River. What makes the Water Forum's program unique is that we continue monitoring these sites over time and

use what we learn to make targeted habitat enhancements that provide the greatest benefit for salmon and steelhead.”

The project will also monitor how salmon and steelhead use enhanced habitat. It will also map the river corridor using advanced sonar and LiDAR technology to identify future habitat enhancement opportunities. And conduct scientific studies to better understand how habitat enhancement influences fish survival and reproduction.

The second award—\$627,835—will fund a major new study of Central Valley steelhead in the lower American River.

“Steelhead are much more difficult to study than salmon because their behavior and life cycles vary considerably and they are fewer in number,” Bishop said. “This study will help answer important questions about how steelhead grow, move through the river, survive and return to spawn.”

The findings will help scientists and resource managers make more informed decisions to protect this species that is listed as threatened under the Endangered Species Acts. The study will complement similar research on the Stanislaus River, providing valuable comparisons between steelhead populations north and south of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta.

The awards build on more than two decades of collaboration under the Water Forum Agreement and support implementation of the Water Forum 2050 Agreement, which strengthens the region's commitment to habitat enhancement, scientific monitoring and collaborative solutions that protect the lower American River while supporting long-term water supply reliability.

The awards, announced by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, include two of only 10 projects selected statewide through the Central Valley Project Improvement Act. The Water Forum received one of just four habitat enhancement awards and one of six scientific research awards funded this year.

Funding is provided through the Central Valley Project Improvement Act. The steelhead study grant will be administered by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, while the habitat enhancement grant will be administered by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation. ★

Tech Devices in California’s New Cars Create Thorny Political Issues

Automobiles have gradually evolved over the last two decades from mechanical devices into electronic platforms featuring computer screens and numerous other digital capabilities.

A few years ago, the California Air Resources Board began requiring automakers to install devices in vehicles to record and store operational data that the agency could access to determine how well emission reduction programs were working.

It was one aspect of the state’s announced goal of phasing out cars and trucks powered by gasoline and diesel fuel and replacing them with zero-emission vehicles.

The auto industry opposed the data collection mandate, arguing it would violate the privacy of vehicle owners. At one point the industry threatened to stop producing cars for California.

The agency insisted it would not collect data involuntarily. But its regulation fueled — pun intended — suspicions in some quarters that recording how and where cars were being used would allow them to be tracked, much as cellphone usage can be traced.

Or, some said, as gas and diesel use declined and gallonage taxes dropped, the

state could begin charging drivers by miles driven, based on their recorded data.

As the data collection mandate was being implemented, another aspect of the situation surfaced — fears that the tracking software to help motorists obtain help in emergencies, such as General Motors’ OnStar system, could be misused by abusive spouses to find and attack their mates.

Two years ago, the Legislature and Gov. Gavin Newsom enacted a law aimed at countering that potential abuse. Senate Bill 1394 required automakers to provide an internet process by which a “connected vehicle service” could be quickly terminated. Those seeking termination would have to prove they either owned the vehicle or possessed it via a divorce decree or domestic violence restraining order.

That was the relatively easy part of SB 1384.

The more contentious portion of the law required new cars to be equipped with a “mechanism that can be used by a driver who is inside a vehicle to immediately disable connected vehicle location access.” The mechanism had to be “prominently located, easy to use, not require access to an online application, not require a password or login information, and only allow re-enabling of the connected vehicle location access by a driver who is located inside the vehicle.”

The deadline for meeting that requirement was last week. The industry has insisted that was, from a practical standpoint, impossible to meet because it is a

complex engineering problem that involves dozens of different auto models, and automakers would have to maintain existing electronic tools, such as GPS navigation, and helpful services, such as OnStar.

Without a change in the mandate, the industry’s lobbyists warned, automakers could be compelled to suspend sales in the state, echoing a threat they made about the Air Resources Board’s data collection mandate earlier.

It was something of a political standoff until Senate Bill 719 emerged from backroom negotiations late last month. Just one day before the deadline, Newsom signed the bill that narrows the application of the requirement, eliminates the hard deadline for it and substitutes a series of deadlines tied to model years and “technological feasibility.”

Thus it is impossible to say for certain when, if ever, cars will be equipped with the ability to disconnect location tracking software.

These two instances imply that the conversion of the automobile from a mechanical device to an electronic one has created a bottomless well of potential issues involving privacy, governmental regulation and the politically heated topic of how California would change the way motorists are taxed once the gallonage taxes on fuels disappear, if they ever do.

Social Security Matters

When Should My Wife File for Spouse Benefits?

Dear Rusty: My wife is 66 (born February 1960) and started taking Social Security retirement benefits just over one year ago at age 65. She was a stay-at-home Mom for most of her adult life. I turned 62 this past March and received my first SS payment recently for a May 2026 start. We are scheduled to meet with SSA in late July to initiate spousal benefits because my wife’s current benefits are less than 50% of mine. We also have an adult disabled son who receives Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Social Security benefits (this split in benefit sources happened after my wife filed - that whole process was confusing and we don’t understand it). My question relates to spousal benefits (I was a career finance person but don’t completely understand these rules). We were going to file in July but is there any benefit to waiting until she turns 67? And will her 50% benefit be 50% of my filing at 62 or is that based on another amount? Signed: **Confused Finance Guy**

Dear Confused: First, be aware that your wife’s spousal benefit will be based on her age when she claims it, and half of your full retirement

age, or “FRA,” amount (although you claimed at 62, her benefit as your spouse will still be based on your FRA entitlement).

Because she claimed her SS retirement at 65, your wife will not get 50% of your FRA entitlement; rather she will get her own reduced SS retirement benefit (which was reduced by about 13% from her FRA entitlement) plus a “spousal boost.” The amount of that “boost” will be the difference between her own FRA entitlement and half of your FRA entitlement, but that boost amount will also be reduced because she will be claiming in July before her FRA.

Your wife will reach her FRA in February 2027, so by claiming her spousal boost in July her boost amount will be reduced by about 5%, and the “boost” will be added to her already reduced SS retirement about. The result will be your wife’s benefit as your spouse will be less than 50% of your FRA entitlement. And, FYI, your wife will be automatically deemed to be filing for her spousal benefit (she will not be able to defer claiming it).

As your son is now collecting SS benefits based on your wife’s personal SS record, you should ask Social Security to switch him over to payments based on your record (because you have the higher SS benefit). FYI, because your son is now receiving SSI (Supplemental Security Income), the SSDI (SS disability) benefit he receives will offset by his SSI benefit, and the payment amount will consist of two sources - SSI and SSDI. Nevertheless,

he cannot get more than 50% of your SS retirement amount and will likely be affected by the Family Maximum which may further reduce his SSDI entitlement.

Your wife’s benefit as your spouse will also be affected by the “Family Maximum,” which limits how much can be paid on any one person’s SS record (on your SS record). That also means that your wife will not get a full 50% of your FRA entitlement; rather she will get less because the family maximum limits how much all your dependents can receive to somewhere between 50% and 88% of your FRA benefit amount (after subtracting your own SS entitlement). That also means that your son’s SS payment, as well as your wife’s SS payment as your spouse, will be reduced to less than 50% of your FRA entitlement. SSA will be able to guide you through the Family Maximum calculations for both your son and your wife when you meet.

To recap all of this: a) your wife will be automatically deemed to be filing for her spousal benefit; she cannot delay until her FRA. b) her amount as your spouse will be less than 50% of your SS FRA entitlement. And c) both your wife’s and your son’s SS benefit will likely be also affected by the Family Maximum and, thus, be less than half of your FRA entitlement. Nevertheless, it was likely the right decision to claim as you have, considering that your son and wife have been receiving SS benefits for some time now, and both will continue to receive more as your dependents. ★



Congress has been known to slip indefensible special-interest provisions into large must-pass bills when no one is looking. What it has never done before is use such sleight of hand to hand over control of the U.S. military to a foreign country. But that’s what we’re told is on the verge of happening on Capitol Hill.

The House just passed the National Defense Authorization Act, a sprawling \$1.15 trillion bill that supposedly includes a provision buried in it “merging” the U.S. and Israeli militaries.

This provision, known as Section 219, has united some of the most fervent anti-Israel conspiracy theorists on the right and the left in denouncing the alleged betrayal of America, from Marjorie Taylor Greene to AOC, from Tucker Carlson to Cenk Uygur.

AOC has warned that the provision “is an existential threat to American sovereignty and democracy.” Marjorie Taylor Greene has said anyone who voted for the bill “sold out the American people to a foreign country.” Tucker Carlson wants literal treason trials.

So what is the substance of Section 219? Legislation often has obfuscatory titles, but this provision is deemed, with admirable clarity, the United States-Israel Defense Technology Cooperation Initiative. It calls for the secretary of defense to designate “an executive agent”

The preposterous case against the new defense bill

to coordinate between the U.S. and Israel on “bilateral defense technology research, development, testing, evaluation, integration and industrial cooperation.” The Pentagon will come up with a plan for such cooperation and report back to Congress.

That’s it. There is nothing about merging the general staffs of the U.S. military and the IDF; nothing about creating a joint office where Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth and his Israeli counterpart, Israel Katz, work together; nothing about giving Bibi Netanyahu partial control of CENTCOM.

That the United States would want a close working relationship with Israel on military technology is hardly surprising. Israel is one of the world’s most innovative societies and, given its precarious security environment, has become a leader in advanced defense technologies.

That a nefarious interpretation of the bill has gotten some traction underlines how any preposterous lie, so long as it’s about Israel, gets a hearing these days. Like many conspiracy theories, this one depends on a dark view of American society. We are allegedly so corrupt that we are handing control of our military to a foreign country without any senior military leaders or officials in an “America First” administration lodging a complaint. No wonder Tucker Carlson wants the kind of tribunals that attended the end of World War II.

At the first Nuremberg Trials, Wilhelm Keitel was found guilty of crimes against humanity

and hanged; at the second Nuremberg Trials, Mike Johnson will be found guilty of supporting mutually beneficial technology sharing between allies -- means of execution yet to be determined.

One perversity here is that Netanyahu conceives of the technological cooperation as a substitute for the U.S. military aid that he supports phasing out. In other words, enemies of Israel oppose U.S. military aid, and when a constructive plan is offered for how to go about ending it, they oppose that, too, as an Israeli plot.

Another perversity is that the U.S. should want a very close relationship with Israel on missile defense, an area where Israel excels and that, as we’ve seen in the Ukraine and Iran wars, is crucial to modern warfare. And yet, the same people who portray themselves as zealously protective of the U.S. national interest want us to turn our back on a source of technological advance.

Israel naturally fits in the Western alliance, but nations ultimately pursue their selfish interests. If we spurn the Jewish state out of irrational animus, it will inevitably look elsewhere and perhaps build a stronger relationship with China. Then we will surely be told by the critics now obsessed with ending the U.S.-Israel relationship that Israel has shown its true colors and deserves even more of our scorn.

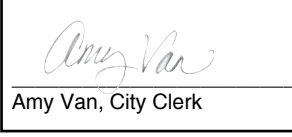

New Self-Serve Recycling Facility Pending Final Certification

representative for CalRecycles in Sacramento didn't respond to a request for comment regarding the specific status of the application now filed by Ivan's Recycling LLC.

The couple operate two recycling ventures, Simply Recycle in Fair Oaks, and their primary facility at 8002 Zenith Drive in Citrus Heights.

Simply Recycle, opened in November 2024, and located at 4802 San Juan Ave., in Fair Oaks, uses advanced automation technology to eliminate the need to pre-sort, crush and weigh California Redemption Value (CRV) eligible recyclables.

Their Fair Oaks facility, which was also funded by a CalRecycle grant, allows customers to receive deposit vouchers within minutes of dropping off their material, which they can redeem for cash on the spot.

Last summer, Ivan's Recycling LLC partnered with CLYNK, headquartered in South Portland, Maine for the delivery of a prefabricated, container-style self-service kiosk measuring 160 square feet, or eight feet by 20 feet, with three secured access doors where users can drop off different types of redeemable beverage containers by using a mobile app. Payment is issued electronically to the customer within one to two business days.

The new Citrus Heights mobile recycling center will be situated in the parking lot near the corner of Woodmore Oaks Drive and Sunrise Boulevard. The mobile kiosk has since been completed and is waiting for external company signage to

be added, she said.

Several drop windows for different types of recyclables are shown, with large, easy-to-read instructions displayed on the front of the kiosk.

A Clynk mobile recycling unit seen in operation in the Northeast features an overhang that includes lights, which would protect customers from the elements.

Once operational, customers will be able to create a personal account, accumulate a balance and use funds at their discretion (for cash, groceries, or electronic donations to community organizations), according to Clynk.

The planned opening of a new mobile recycling center on the east side of Citrus Heights is a complimentary addition to the couple's existing facility on the west side of the city near Lichen Drive and their second center in Fair Oaks, they said.

The new recycling facility also satisfies the city's planning requirements "for a responsible, secure, and community-friendly solution that aligns with the city's goals to reduce litter, improve environmental outcomes, and to serve local residents on the east side of the city.
