City manager highlights growth, redevelopment and investment

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Citrus Heights is positioning itself for a new phase of economic growth, with redevelopment at Sunrise Mall, new businesses, infrastructure investments and public safety improvements among the city’s priorities, according to City Manager Ash Feeney. Feeney was the featured speaker at the Aug. 11 ACCESS Citrus Heights Luncheon at the Citrus Heights Event Center. The monthly gathering, hosted

by the Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce, brought business and community leaders together for

a question-and-answer discussion led by Chamber Executive Director Sheri Merrick. The city of Citrus Heights and Republic Services sponsored the luncheon, with lunch provided by Red Robin. “We are a city on the move,” Feeney said, pointing to progress in economic development, infrastructure, community events and efforts to attract families and young people to Citrus Heights. 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Council Approves Cost-Share Agreement with County for Road Resurfacing

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - At the Aug. 12 meeting, the Citrus Heights City Council considered permission for Councilmember Kelsey Nelson to have 60 days of parental leave time with her new baby. The permission would cover absences from city council meetings between August and October, depending on the timing of the baby’s birth. Permission is required from the council because under California government code, if a councilmember is absent from all meetings within 60 days without permission, that seat is considered vacant and would need to be filled. If council approves the parental leave period, then Nelson’s absences would be excused, and she is able to retain her seat on the council.

Councilmember Tim Schaefer said he’s excited for Nelson to spend that time bonding with her new baby, but he worried it could be tough for the council to pass items while she’s gone if they split on a 2-2 vote. He suggested the possibility of Nelson calling into some meetings on Zoom if she felt up for it. Councilmember Nelson said she hopes to still attend some meetings during that time and would be willing to call in on Zoom when possible. Vice Mayor Porsche Middleton said it was important to ensure Nelson has the flexibility to attend when possible but to give her whatever time she needs to recover and bond with her baby. The council voted 4-0 to approve the parental leave request, with Nelson abstaining. The council considered a cost-sharing agreement with Sacramento County for the AC Overlay Project 2025 Phase A—the Madison Avenue Overlay Project. Citrus Heights and Sacramento County share ownership of roadways along the perimeter of the city, so they collaborate on maintenance and capital improvements, including road resurfacing. In 2025, the county collected bids

of the Sunrise Mall property under the Sunrise Tomorrow specific plan.

Feeney said Tallen Capital Partners CEO Terrence P. Tallen is leading redevelopment efforts and described the planned Sunrise Sports Complex as an important catalyst for the larger property. The sports complex is expected to occupy about 14 acres, leaving approximately 86 acres available for additional development.

“This type of development is how you get people back in the city,” Feeney said.

He also addressed concerns about how the sports complex would be financed. Feeney said bonds expected to cover roughly half of the project cost would be repaid through revenue generated by the project rather than the city’s general fund.

Merrick emphasized the distinction, saying community discussions have included confusion over whether residents’ tax dollars would be used to pay for the facility. She said events such as the ACCESS luncheon give business leaders an opportunity to hear directly from city officials and share accurate information.

“One of the reasons I love this event is that we educate those that are willing to attend,” said Merrick. “The more advocates that we can have out in our community, the better for our

community as a whole.”

Development activity is also continuing outside the mall property.

Along Auburn Boulevard, Feeney highlighted several businesses and investments, including an ATV and e-bike retailer expected to open at Citrus Grove Town Center. He said the business fits an emerging outdoor recreation theme along the corridor, which already includes businesses connected to kayaking and fly-fishing.

Feeney also pointed to the recently opened food truck plaza as another type of economic opportunity, describing it as an incubator for entrepreneurs who may eventually move from operating food trucks to opening

permanent restaurants.

The city’s financial position was another focus of the discussion. Feeney said Citrus Heights projects approximately \$47.1 million in general fund revenue and \$46.8 million in expenditures for the current fiscal year, allowing the city to contribute to reserves while continuing to monitor declining revenue trends affecting municipalities across California.

“We will continue to remain in a sound fiscal position,” Feeney said.

Public safety remains another priority, particularly for businesses. Feeney said the city recorded its lowest crime rate since incorporation last year and credited focused policing strategies, staffing decisions and

specialty units targeting problems including blight, retail crime and narcotics.

He pointed to a recent fentanyl seizure as an example of work being done by specialized investigators.

“There were enough doses to kill 3 million people,” said Feeney.

He also said coordinated efforts between police and city beautification crews have helped reduce large encampments, sidewalk debris and other visible blight.

Infrastructure investments are also occurring throughout Citrus Heights.

Feeney said work along Auburn Boulevard is nearing completion, with a ribbon-cutting planned for the end of the month. Residential

resurfacing is underway across the city, and more than 100 streets are expected to be resurfaced this year. The city is also pursuing outside transportation funding, including a recommended grant of more than \$1.9 million through the Sacramento Area Council of Governments’ active transportation program.

For businesses considering Citrus Heights, Feeney said the city’s approach is centered on helping projects move forward rather than creating unnecessary obstacles.

“We have a general philosophy of being facilitators, not regulators,” he said. “Time is money.”

Feeney credited partnerships with the Chamber, local businesses and community organizations as essential to the city’s progress and said those relationships help officials understand what businesses need.

When asked what he hopes the community will be discussing at next year’s luncheon, Feeney looked again to Sunrise Mall. Last year, he said, the goal was to reach an announcement showing tangible movement at the property.

That announcement came.

This year, Feeney said, the next milestone is clear.

“My goal will be at the end of the year that we’re talking about a construction schedule,” he said

vendors, including Monarcas Birrieria y Botanas, Bingsu Bliss, Bacon Mania, 5 River Pizza & Tandoori Grill, one of the first vendors; Kado’s Asian Grill, Sweets Drinks & Treats, Topsy Cheese, Hefty Gyros, Bubble Hive and Luna Café.

Although the food court had been open for little over a month since the food trucks rolled in, morning business at the Luna Café, serving up hot coffee to morning Auburn Boulevard commuters has generally been good.

The Citrus Heights Food Plaza is open daily, except for Thursday, from 6:30 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Several individual families interviewed said they enjoyed the diverse lineup of different food vendors representing Mexican, Indian, Mediterranean and Asian-inspired cuisine, as well as pizza, available now all in one place and which appeals to all ages and tastes.

Convenience and choice were two top reasons they said for returning for another lunch or dinner visit. Refreshing iced specialty drinks, desserts, coffee and sweet treats are also available.

The Citrus Heights Food Plaza is gated, allowing families to feel safe, Singh said, adding that there are clean restrooms and

32 parking spots, including handicapped parking and four Electric Vehicle (EV) charging stations. The site is also ADA disability compliant, pet friendly and has security camera signage clearly posted on walk-in gates.

Customers are welcome to take their food to go or simply enjoy their evening meal at covered tables under the lights. Singh said alcoholic beverages will not be available from any food trucks on site.

Electrical and water hookups, and applicable garbage and food waste disposal locations for each of the participating food trucks in the plaza are provided. The parking lot also has an electric gate which closes at night, securing the plaza.

In all, the new food truck plaza can provide permanent facilities for up to 16 food trucks to operate on the premises daily.

In an earlier interview, Singh said the project experienced several delays due to necessary environmental reviews, regulatory requirements and permitting, as well as utility company requirements before setting a final opening date.

The Citrus Heights Food Plaza is located at 7509 Twin Oaks Ave. on the corner of Auburn Drive.

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Emil Giusti to Celebrate 100 Years

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Faith, Family, Country, Community.

These are all cherished values held deeply by long-time Citrus Heights resident Emil Giusti, who is now nearing his 100th birthday, and his late wife Barbara.

On Saturday, Sept. 12, the children, grand-children and great-grand-children of Emil Giusti will gather at the Giusti Family Ranch in Citrus Heights for a very special celebration, honoring a truly remarkable man whose century of life and service to others is a profound gift and a remarkable inspiration to us all.

Formal honors and special presentations in celebration of his birthday milestone will be made to Giusti by the city of Citrus Heights and local public officials.

Barbara passed away on Oct. 29, 2015, but will no doubt be looking down from heaven upon her long-time love, whom she affectionately called “Giusti-fruit” after the popular chewing gum.

She met the young man who would become her sweetheart, then a returning World War II Army combat veteran of the Philippine campaign at an Odd Fellows barn dance in 1946 when the city of Citrus Heights was just a rural community called Sylvan.

“Mom was much younger than Dad,” recalls his daughter Carla.

“She also grew up in Sylvan, now Citrus Heights and knew Dad when he was a young man. They soon started dating, once Mom turned 18. Together, they were married a few months shy of 65 years before Mom passed away in October 2015,” she said.

Barbara married Emil, the love of her life, on March 16, 1951, at the Nazarene Church in Roseville.

The couple gave birth to six beautiful children. Their first child, Christina Lynn, passed away shortly after her birth in 1953. On May 10, 1954, Barbara gave birth to the oldest of her five children, Susan Elaine. She then gave birth to Linda Marie on Oct. 19, 1955, followed by her only son, Craig Allen, on Dec. 19, 1956. Carla Jean, her fourth child, was born on Sept. 10, 1958. The youngest of Barbara’s children, Laura Lynn, was born on May 2, 1960.

As her children grew, and then married, Barbara experienced the joys of parenting all over again with a whole new perspective: as a grandmother. With 13 grandchildren and four step-grandchildren, there is no doubt Barbara over-filled her duty as a grandmother, Carla said, describing her. Her love has expanded across many generations, and her legacy will continue on through her great-grandchildren, she said.

Craig and Carla invited me to meet their father Emil at the long-time family home on Sycamore Drive in Citrus Heights.

Emil also kindly took time away from watching an afternoon San Francisco Giants baseball game to remember his days as a young man, just beginning his senior year

at San Juan High School in the fall of 1944 during World War II when he was called up by the local Draft Board at age 18 to start Army basic training.

“I registered for the draft in September when I turned 18, and in November 18th, I got called up,” he said.

The youthful recruit was soon headed off for basic combat training with the U.S. Army’s 88th Infantry Training Battalion at Camp Roberts in central California. His older brother, Mario preceded him in the Army, serving as a surgical technician and his younger brother Joseph would serve with the U.S. 766th Railway Battalion in France and Germany.

The three brothers, Mario, Emil and Joseph are inscribed on a commemorative plaque in a World War II remembrance garden in Rusch Community Park in Citrus Heights for their wartime service.

Emil was born in Roseville on Sept. 13, 1926, to Pietro and Josephine Giusti of Roseville, and is one of nine children. In 1930, Emil’s father bought the Giusti family ranch at 7665 Twin Oaks in Sylvan on a handshake and within

five years had paid off the family house.

Emil lived on Twin Oaks family farm from 1930 until he married Barbara and they raised their family on Sycamore Drive.

Raised by her mother and step-father, Jim, Barbara was the oldest of four children. Her three brothers were Lester “Dale” Lawson, Linvel James Phillips and William Warren Phillips.

Pietro worked at the Roseville Southern Pacific Railroad. All his sons also worked at the Roseville Railroad, including Louie, Joseph, Mario, Emil and John. Emil himself worked at the railroad on weekends while attending San Juan High School.

Life on the Giusti family ranch remains full of rich memories remembering hunting pheasants to bring home for dinner and raising chicken to take eggs to market in San Francisco and meet his older sister Ann.

Emil recalled attending Sylvan School, now the Citrus Heights Veterans Community Center before attending San Juan High School. He was a member of 4H, Future Farmers of America (FFA) and ran cross-country on the high school

track team.

Emil also picked up part-time work while attending high school. As part of his class credits at San Juan High, he recalled pruning trees in nearby orchards and working part-time for the Southern Pacific Railroad, following his father’s second professional career outside of the thriving family farm.

During his wartime service, Giusti served with the Company C of the 145th Infantry Regiment and served with the U.S. 37th “Buckeye” Infantry during World War II, participating in the Philippines campaign and the Battle of Manila in February 1945.

For his wartime service in the U.S. Army, Giusti earned the Combat Infantryman’s Badge (CIB), Giusti received the Philippine Liberation Ribbon with 1 Bronze Star, the Army Good Conduct Medal, the Asiatic Pacific Campaign Medal, World War II Victory Medal and the Philippine Independence Ribbon.

His discharge papers indicate that he was wounded in action during the battle for Luzon but was not awarded a Purple Heart Medal. The family is working with the U.S. Department of

Veterans Affairs and Congressman Ami Bera’s office to review his Army service record to see if this unreceived miliary honor can be properly presented to him.

The U.S. 37th Infantry Division was part of the U.S. forces in the Pacific Theater, fighting through the Northern Solomons and the Luzon campaign under the command of Gen. Douglas MacArthur. Giusti’s 145th Infantry Regiment, as part of the 73rd Infantry Brigade, advanced into Manila in early 1945 after the Japanese surrender.

Giusti concluded his enlisted Army service as a corporal in a military police unit and recalls escorting a Japanese general to Clark Field in the Philippines for a post-war criminal war trial.

He was discharged from the U.S. Army in November 1946 and returned to his parent’s home and went back to the Southern Pacific Railroad to get his pre-war job back.

Emil said he enjoyed the friendships he made during his work as a machinist and later a machinist foreman for the Southern Pacific until he retired in 1987.

Emil and Barbara were remarried in the Catholic Church and were active parishioners at Holy Family Catholic Church in Citrus Heights from its inception.

During her lifetime, Barbara was a long-time active member of the Holy Family Church. She was a member and past president (1978-80) of the Catholic Ladies Relief Society (CLRS), No. 11 of the Sacramento Diocese and was named “Woman of the Year” award from the Sacramento Deanery of Catholic Ladies.

In May 2015, she became the new grand president of the Sacramento Diocese Grand Council of the CLRS. Barbara also served as a member of the Christ the King Retreat Center Guild and the local Ladies Auxiliary for the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW).

Emil was active in the Knights of Columbus and Barbara was in the Catholic Ladies Relief Society. As part of the relief society, Barbara and Emil started a food closet in the family garage.

With the Knights of Columbus organization, Emil also helped support the ministry at the parish in various ways. They cooked a monthly breakfast for parishioners, aiding in selling fireworks, spaghetti feeds, father daughter dances and many other church functions.

Emil’s birthday celebration is hosted by his children, Susan (Roy) Frank, Linda (Steven) Fretwell, Craig (Dora) Giusti, Carla (Dean) Tilford and Laura (Phil) McCrory.

Birthday guests should arrive at the Giusti family ranch at 7655 Twin Oaks Ave. in Citrus Heights on Saturday, Sept. 12 between 11:30 and 11:50 am.

Desserts and sweets will be provided by the event hosts. Formal honors and special presentations in celebration of his birthday milestone will be made to Emil by the city of Citrus Heights and local officials will also be made. ★

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Firework Citations Down in 2026

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The circumstances which could have provided for an unexpected burst in fireworks citations in the city of Citrus Heights during the recent July 4th holiday falling on a Saturday and the observance of the nation’s 250th birthday, didn’t happen.

In an unusually brief report to the Citrus Heights City Council on Wednesday, Aug. 12, Citrus Heights Police Chief Alex Turcotte said overall calls for service regarding illegal fireworks decreased by 54 percent over this past Fourth of July, with the department only just issuing two citations for illegal fireworks violations.

Turcotte said he was “very happy with the measures our community took to try to celebrate responsibly.”

“The goal of increasing the penalties last year was about education and curbing behavior, not about collecting money,” he said.

Turcotte said Wednesday that the department “tries to be reasonable” and attribute fines to those who are most responsible for the property based on available evidence through internal reviews.

The Police Department said only \$2,000 in fines were issued for illegal fireworks over the Fourth of July holiday weekend, along with a courtesy warning letter sent to one individual, he told council members.

Sales of “safe and sane” fireworks are often one of the biggest annual fundraisers for various nonprofit organizations, with sales legally allowed to begin in the city at noon June 28 and continue through July 4 until 11 p.m.

The police chief provided a summary of operational highlights of this year’s comprehensive enforcement effort, acknowledging the combined efforts of all involved.

“This year 164 calls for service regarding illegal fireworks came into the dispatch center, compared to 360 in 2025, representing a 54 percent decrease,” Turcotte said. Police officers only had enough information to respond to 27 incidents, he reported.

Turcotte attributed the low volume of response to the fact that the holiday fell on a Saturday, which is normally busy for police officers already.

Under recently updated city illegal fireworks ordinances, each device discharged is considered a separate violation.

Last year, police said 49 citations were issued over the holiday weekend and that 360 illegal calls for service were logged regarding illegal fireworks.

Citrus Heights Police Logs between July 3 and July 5, 2025, show almost 300 illegal fireworks calls, with the majority of calls occurring on July 4. Of the 49 citations issued in 2025, 21 were observed through the use of aerial drones in the air.

This continued mix of enhanced enforcement measures including aerial drones, combined with ongoing public

education efforts in advance of the holiday is continuing to prove successful, Turcotte told council members.

During the past year, CHPD internal review did bring down the number of fines issued in 2025 from around \$300,000 to \$103,000, Turcotte said, adding that the records unit has assisted in both helping track data and helping those who wish to protest their fines do so without having to first put up a portion of the fine prior to having a hearing.

The CHPD records unit allows offenders to set up payment plan options, allowing people to pay for fines over time and thus far, \$25,000 in fines has been collected with \$78,000 still outstanding, he said.

This year, enhanced laws, higher fines, proactive outreach and unmanned aerial support (UAS) drone support combined to improve enforcement and community safety during peak fireworks times over the July 4 holiday, according to CHPD.

CHPD uses trained Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) pilots to operate drones in difficult airspace where they can take footage of illegal fireworks, and with the help of a map overlay, identify specific addresses where illegal fireworks were being discharged in real time.

Updates to the city fireworks ordinance which have increased fines and tightened enforcement capabilities for the CHPD continue to have a measurable deterring effect upon potential violators, Turcotte told the council.

While sales hours were increased from 9 p.m. to 11 p.m., a prior ordinance which was made permanent by the Citrus Heights City Council in 2022 prohibits setting off fireworks after 11 p.m. in the city, including those labeled “safe and sane.”

In 2025, fines were increased from \$750 to \$1,000 for a first offense. The city also revised its social host ordinance to include property that is under the “apparent control” of a property owner, which could include sidewalks or other adjacent land.

The city’s fireworks code has since added a \$5,000 per device fine for third and subsequent violations within one year and changed the violation type to an infraction where it had previously been listed as a misdemeanor.

The city ordinance also allows authorities to cite landlords and those deemed “social hosts,” if illegal fireworks were discharged on the property.

The Citrus Heights Police Department also has a witness attestation program, which allows officers to press charges on residents who light off illegal fireworks from witnesses willing to testify in person that they observed illegal fireworks being discharged.

Residents in the city are continuing to use the SeeClickFix app to send in reports of illegal fireworks online and to indicate whether they were willing to be a witness and attest to the crime.

The SeeClickFix online application saw just 26 total reports in 2026, compared to 61 reports last year. ★

for resurfacing a portion of Madison Avenue from east of San Juan Avenue to Fair Oaks Boulevard. The county is fully managing the construction of the project, and the city will reimburse the county for the city’s proportional share of the cost.

The project includes a full asphalt concrete overlay along all lanes of travel, ADA ramp reconstruction, targeted mill and fill base repairs, and restriped lane lines, pavement legends and crosswalks.

The city’s share is approximately \$1.96 million in repaving costs, with additional costs for design, inspection and contingencies. The total of the city’s share is expected not to exceed \$2.7 million.

The cost-share agreement won’t have an additional fiscal impact on the city’s general fund since the proposed reimbursement total will come from the current Capital Improvement Project fund, which is already included in the city’s approved budget.

The council voted unanimously to approve the cost-share agreement.

The council also considered a resolution authorizing the city to participate in the California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (CUPCCAA), which is a voluntary program allowing public agencies to use alternative bidding procedures for public works projects under certain cost thresholds. These less formal processes would allow the city to establish a list of eligible contractors to work with rather than advertising a full bid package for every project.

This streamlined accounting and bidding framework for smaller public works projects will help the city save money and move forward with projects more quickly, while still maintaining transparency and competitive pricing.

Projects are eligible for this streamlined process if they are under \$220,000. Any projects above that threshold will still have to go through the formal competitive bidding procedures.

The council voted unanimously to authorize participation in the program.

The next meeting of the Citrus Heights City Council is scheduled for Aug. 26. ★

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Sacramento County Water Agency Wraps Up 10-Year Water Meter and Pipe Improvement Project

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Water Agency (SCWA) has completed its biggest construction project ever. In August, SCWA wrapped up a \$160 million project to upgrade the water system in the Arden area. The Arden Service Area Pipe and Meter Installation Project spanned 10 years, and SCWA installed approximately 38 miles of new water distribution pipelines and more than 3,000 new water meters.

Project Manager Helen Rocha guided the project since its inception, holding community meetings and speaking with residents individually to educate homeowners and businesses about the project. This section of the Arden area was the

last section in California to not have water meters. The switch to a metered system began after the state passed Assembly Bill 2572, requiring the installation of

water meters in 2004. The Water Agency started installing the meters in 2016.

The project also replaced waterlines that have been in service for

decades. Some of the oldest pipes were nearly 85 years old, installed during World War II. Due to the aging system, the infrastructure around the Arden Service

Area was in danger of pipe material failure and leaks. The new pipes provide better water flow to homes and businesses while reducing maintenance costs for SCWA. The upgraded system also improves fire flow standards to meet state guidelines offering firefighters better water pressure from hydrants in case they're needed.

Over the years, this project, conducted in six separate phases, won various construction awards from the American Society of Civil Engineers, including the Outstanding Community Improvement Project Award in the state of California in 2022.

Beyond the improvements to the water infrastructure, the project also included partnering with the Department of Transportation to provide street repaving in each phase once the pipes were installed. ★

Interested in How California Pays for State Government? Here's Where to Find the Data

The state budget is an obvious source for anyone interested in how California finances its programs.

However the budget, including the latest version enacted in June, is only a rough outline, a collection of suppositions and guesses, some educated, others politically motivated.

An obvious example is what happened four years ago when Gov. Gavin Newsom declared that California had a \$97.5 billion surplus, bragging “no other state in American history has ever experienced a surplus as large as this.”

That number never appeared in the budget, but legislators immediately pumped up spending. The surplus turned out to be a mirage based on what officials later acknowledged was a \$165 billion error in revenue estimates.

However, the spending increases were already in effect, leading to chronic, multibillion-dollar deficits ever since. Moreover, one piece of increased spending, the extension of health care coverage to undocumented immigrants, cost \$6.2 billion more than assumed in the budget, resulting in cutbacks of coverage.

While the budget itself is an imprecise source of financial information, its addenda provide troves of useful

data for those savvy enough to find them. They reveal such statistics as how many employee positions the state has (482,088), a list of the state's outstanding bond debts (\$73 billion) and how much the state collects from dozens of specific taxes and fees (\$328.4 billion).

One particularly interesting chart provides details on revenues and spending year-by-year, dating back to 1975. It reveals that income, outgo and the size of the state payroll remained stable relative to the growth in California's population and personal income, until Newsom became governor in 2019.

Since then, the state has added about 100,000 positions to its payroll, increasing it by one-third, relative to population. State general fund spending rose from 7.9% of total personal income in 2019-20 to 9.58% in 2023-24, the highest ever recorded since 1975. It now stands at 9.42%.

Those numbers are why Newsom will be leaving his successor a very unbalanced budget — no matter what he claims. In fact, one addendum projects shortfalls lasting through the next governor's first term, even if general fund spending remains virtually static, which it will not.

Those seeking an even deeper understanding of the state government's financial position have another source: The 372-page “Annual Comprehensive Financial Report” that the state controller's office files with the federal government. Its numbers are rock solid because they have to be and are backed up by audits.

State Controller Malia Cohen issued the 2024-25 report in May, two months after the federal government's deadline — but that

Social Security Matters

I Worked for my Ex-husband but Wasn't Paid and now have little Social Security; What are my options?

Dear Rusty: Sadly, I was in business with my ex-husband. I'm a nurse and he was a chiropractor. He refused to pay me “on the books” and now, at age 73, after divorcing him due to his financial irresponsibility (I don't want to burden you with the thefts that he perpetrated), I am stuck with a small \$773 Social Security payment each month. At age 73 I am now faced with having to go back into the workforce. Is there anything I can do to prove that I worked 40 years for my husband but wasn't paid? **Signed: Distressed Divorcee**

Dear Distressed: We are so sorry to hear of your unfortunate circumstances. Assuming your ex-husband is now collecting Social Security retirement benefits (or is at least eligible to if you are divorced at least 2 years), you should be able to collect an ex-spouse benefit as his former wife. In that case, you would be entitled to receive 50% of the Social Security benefit he was entitled to at his own full retirement age (because he and you were married

for over 10 years).

The way that will work is that you would continue to receive your personally-earned \$773 monthly Social Security retirement amount earned from other employment, but you would also be entitled to a supplemental “spousal boost” to bring your payment up to half of the SS payment amount your ex-husband is entitled to at his SS full retirement age. In other words, because you were married to your ex for more than 10 years, you are entitled to the same Social Security benefits as though you were still married. That is true, even if he has remarried and his new wife is also getting a spouse benefit from his record. You will still be entitled to an ex-spouse benefit from your ex-husband as his former wife. And if he dies before you, as a surviving ex-spouse you will get the same Social Security benefit he was receiving at his death, instead of the smaller amount your will get while you are both living.

Regarding rejoining the workforce, while you can certainly go back to work at age 73 without it negatively affecting your Social Security benefits, if you are struggling financially, I suggest you visit this website sponsored by the National Council on Aging: www.benefitscheckup.org. At this website, you can enter your zip code and find much information about other supplemental

assistance you may be entitled to where you live, including healthcare and medication assistance, housing, nutritional assistance, etc.

Regarding your question: “Is there anything I can do to prove that I worked 40 years and wasn't paid?” Social Security determines benefits based solely on your personal earnings as reported to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), which is, in turn, dependent on how your joint income taxes were filed over the years you worked in your husband's business. Social Security is unable to assist you with IRS matters. I'm afraid yours is more of a legal matter you would need to pursue by discussing your situation directly with the IRS or engaging an attorney for assistance.

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During the 1979-1980 hostage crisis, a defiant Iran starkly demonstrated the limits of American power. Forty-five years later, it is doing the same thing, although in vastly different circumstances. Back then, when the post-Vietnam military was at a low ebb, we didn't strike Iran, and a long-shot rescue operation ended in abject failure.

Now, with the U.S. military at its most proficient and professional in history, we have inflicted punishing blows against the regime but still haven't been able to impose our will, in part because we are running low on the munitions necessary to prosecute the war. Not only is this embarrassing, it is dangerous.

If Operation Midnight Hammer -- last year's lightning strike against Iranian nuclear facilities -- demonstrated the prowess of the U.S. military and sent a useful deterrent message to our enemies, the Iran War is now doing the opposite. We're running low on missiles and interceptors in a months-long conflict with a beleaguered second-rate power. What would happen in a drawn-out war with a major adversary?

President Trump has posted a thunderous denunciation of leaks to the media about our depleted weapons stocks, and the leaks are indeed irresponsible. But this problem is a matter of public record and has been tracked by outside organizations.

A Foreseeable and Dire Munitions Crisis

At the end of July, the Center for Strategic and International Studies estimated that, out of an arsenal of 2,330 Patriot interceptors before the Iran war, we had roughly 800 remaining. We were down to roughly 250 THAAD interceptors from 450 at the start of the war.

On top of this, news organizations are reporting that we are almost out of ATACMS -- a ground-launched precision-strike missile -- and Precision Strike Missiles, the newer, longer-range successor to ATACMS.

This isn't comforting at a time when a war with China could be in the offing. Even before Operation Epic Fury, a war game involving a conflict in the Taiwan Strait conducted by CSIS had the U.S. running out of key munitions in days or weeks.

What happened? This is a crisis a long time in the making. As defense analyst Mackenzie Eaglen of the American Enterprise Institute has warned for years, skimping on the acquisition of munitions was an easy way to meet constrained Pentagon budgets, and we relied on optimistic scenarios about potential wars to justify chronically insufficient production.

For some understandable reasons, we also emphasized sophisticated missiles and interceptors over “good enough” systems. This led to Iran, for instance, forcing us to use highly expensive, difficult-to-replace interceptors against cheap, bulk threats from drones. All this means that we've expended ordnance that it will take us years to build

again. According to media reports, we've used about half our supply of Tomahawk cruise missiles, when we've been manufacturing fewer than 100 a year.

We need to put missile production on a wartime footing, and leverage hungry new defense firms to produce cheaper precision missiles and interceptors at scale. In World War II terms, it's the difference between the easy-to-maintain and mass-produced Sherman tank and the exquisite and powerful, but ultimately impractical Tiger. Whatever advantages the Tiger had in armor and punch, you'd still rather be the U.S. with 50,000 Shermans than the Germans with 1,500 Tigers.

The Trump administration has been talking the right game, and there have been encouraging moves. It has signed agreements to acquire 10,000 cruise missiles over three years at a cost of a few hundred thousand dollars each, far less than a Tomahawk at more than \$2 million.

Wars always bring surprises. It should have been a shock to no one, though, that contemporary military conflict is largely missile warfare, or that we'd have trouble sustaining prolonged hostilities given that we started out with inadequate stocks. The American way of warfare is often to mess it up before adjusting and getting it right. The course correction here should be considered the most urgent priority of U.S. national security.

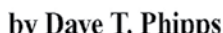

NOTICE OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE**

ORDINANCE NO. 2026-005

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CITRUS HEIGHTS, CALIFORNIA, ADDING DIVISION 6 (“UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION COST ACCOUNTING ACT”) TO ARTICLE V (“FINANCES”) OF CHAPTER 2 (“ADMINISTRATION”) OF THE CITRUS HEIGHTS MUNICIPAL CODE

The foregoing is a summary of an ordinance proposed to be adopted by the City Council of the City of Citrus Heights at its meeting of August 26, 2026.

The City desires to amend the Citrus Heights Municipal Code to include participation in and implementation of the California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (CUPCCAA), a voluntary statutory program that allows public agencies to exercise alternative bidding procedures for public works projects under certain thresholds identified under Public Contract Code (PCC) §22032 and §22034. These alternative bidding procedures allow for less formal processes, saving the agency time and money when seeking cost proposals for Public Works projects.

Upon Council’s adoption of CUPCCAA, the City is authorized to utilize the following bidding procedures based on current Public Contract Code §22032 thresholds:

a) **Public projects up to \$75,000:** May be performed by City employees (force account), negotiated contract, or purchase order.

b) **Public projects up to \$220,000:** May be awarded using informal bidding procedures, which include solicitation of written bids from a list of qualified contractors.

c) **Public projects exceeding \$220,000:** Must be awarded using formal competitive bidding procedures.

Gay Bar Data Harvesting Cameras Mark Turning Sentiment

The last few weeks have seen some amazing instances of a growing policy problem that you face, whether you want to face it or not, just because you have a face.

The most interesting episode was the Gay tracking feature discovered at a group of San Francisco Gay bars that installed PatronScan Guard+ systems (ID scanners + cameras that photograph patrons and collect personal data like names, addresses, genders, and behavior notes).

The customers revolted. The data could be retained and shared across a network of venues using the system for blacklisting problem patrons.

In Chico, the Police Chief apologized that the Flock Camera Data had been shared with other agencies because one of the privacy settings was off.

It's not just the government. Private businesses that take pictures of your face, record what you say and where you go, all claim that the data is not shared, protected, or "encrypted." The fundamental problem is they all lie, and the data miners are getting what they want every time.

One Gay privacy advocate noted that PatronScan does allow you to have your personal information removed from their system... if you go to their website and fill out a form, and the website, yep, it tracks who visits there. It is as if no one has ever heard about what happened to

the Jews in Europe, the Native Americans, and Blacks in the 1940s when Eugenacists would run for County Clerk or Commissioner of Health to add "non-white" information to their list of families that were of "mixed race". Like Christians in Iraq and Lebanon, who were put on "the list" before their houses were bulldozed.

It seems as if our history curriculum in schools has skipped over how many times the people in power make a list and then systematically eliminate the listed individuals.

The Government is prohibited by law from gathering a lot of the data that is being harvested by private industry. Then, by "accident" or by "clicking agree" to a 400-page privacy policy, all the data consolidates. It is insidious and no rational person will believe that the government will protect them while it is acting as a co-conspirator in laying the groundwork for amassing a database that can easily be turned into a "cultural" hit list.

There is a policy solution for this: make gathering consumer data and storing it for more than 60 days illegal, make the fines for "leaking" data massive, increase the amount victims of information theft can receive by lawsuit, and make government data leaking a crime with real consequences.

The jig is up; the American people are seeing every day how this data harvesting is a violation of their rights, and they no longer trust the system.
