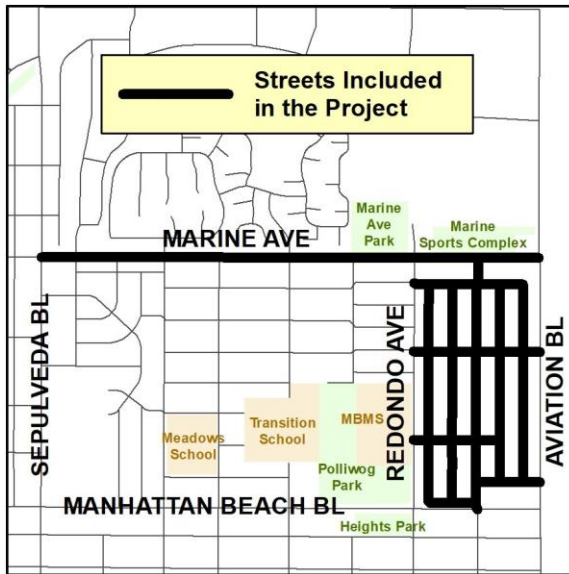

**What is happening on Marine Avenue and Liberty Village in 2018?**

The City of Manhattan Beach will be resurfacing **Marine Avenue**, between **Sepulveda Boulevard** and **Aviation Boulevard**, and the **Liberty Village** neighborhood, bordered by **Marine Avenue**, **Aviation Boulevard**, **Manhattan Beach Boulevard**, and **Redondo Avenue**. Curb ramps along the roadway segments are also scheduled to be rehabilitated or added where they are currently missing.

**Why is construction occurring?**

The street pavement in the project area was last improved in the late-1990s and early-2000s, and is in need of repair. The rehabilitation of the curb ramps is proposed to be conveniently and economically done at the same time, due to deterioration and compliance with new standards.

**How will construction affect traffic? Will there be any lane or street closures?**

Because we are addressing the pavement specifically, lane closures are unavoidable and inevitable. The contractor will make every effort to maintain at least one lane of traffic in each direction.

**Where can I walk while the construction is taking place?**

Since the construction work will affect many areas of the street, detours will sporadically occur around areas of construction. The contractor will provide a clear and safe path around the construction area.

**What month and time of day will the construction occur?**

The contractor will be allowed to work between the hours of 7:30 am and 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday. The work is expected to start in Summer 2018 and is anticipated to be completed in Fall 2018.

**I am a resident along these streets. Will I hear construction from my home?**

Yes. The nature of the work requires the removal of concrete and asphalt which involves saw cutting, jack hammering and grinding of asphalt.
