Drop Everything and Read (DEAR)



Textile Traditions

On February 5-7, the 5th grade students had the opportunity to attend a new class at North House Folk School called, "Textile Traditions." They got to explore the world of textiles through the process of sewing, weaving, and felting. Students were able to work with a local weaver to learn how a loom works, and to try their hand at weaving a section of a tapestry that is now displayed outside of the 5th grade classrooms at Sawtooth. Over the course of the 3-day class, students transformed raw wool into felted pieces that would be useful to them using the stitching skills they learned (i.e. bags, mini-tapestries, hats.) As a bonus, many students were also able to make felted finger puppets. The students had a fun time working together and learning new textile skills!






7th Grade Science Cell Models
