CGI, CajunCodeFest, Waitr and the UL Lafayette School of Computing and Informatics, in cooperation with Congressman Clay Higgins, have joined forces to support Louisiana's 3rd District and STEM education for local middle and high school students through the Congressional App Challenge (CAC).

Our mission is to encourage local students to participate in the competition, connect teams with local mentors, and highlight their hard work with an awards ceremony in December.

WHAT IS THE CONGRESSIONAL APP CHALLENGE?

- The challenge is a public effort to encourage kids to learn how to code, through an annual district-wide competitions hosted by members of Congress for their district.
- Middle and high school students are connected to a mentor or mentor team (a college-level student and a faculty member or professional) to create an app.
- The students will be recognized locally with an awards ceremony and nationally, if they are chosen as one of the best apps.

- Any topic
- Any platform
- Any programming language (no prior coding experience required!)
