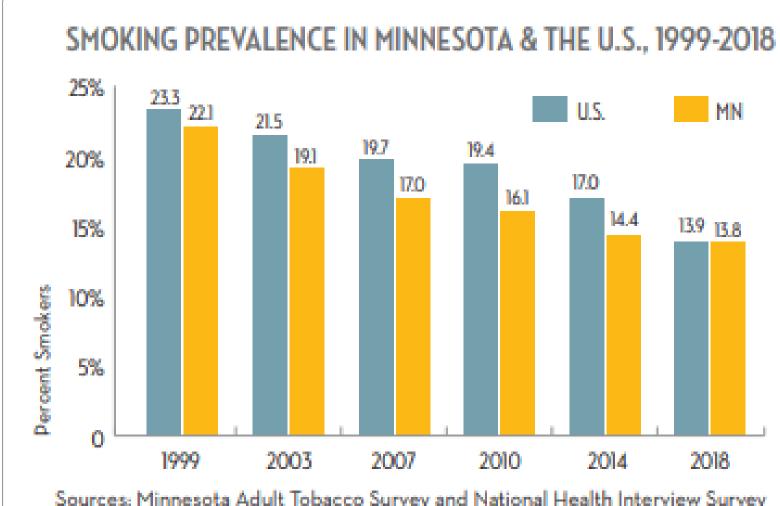

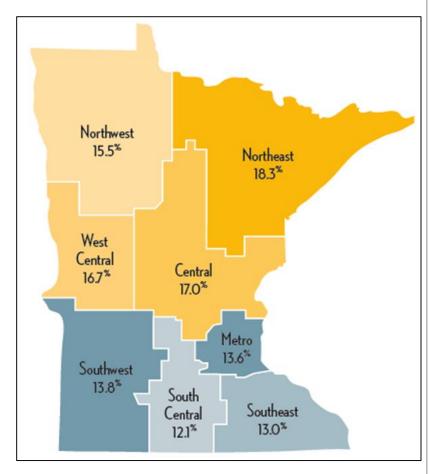

Tobacco use in Minnesota Adults

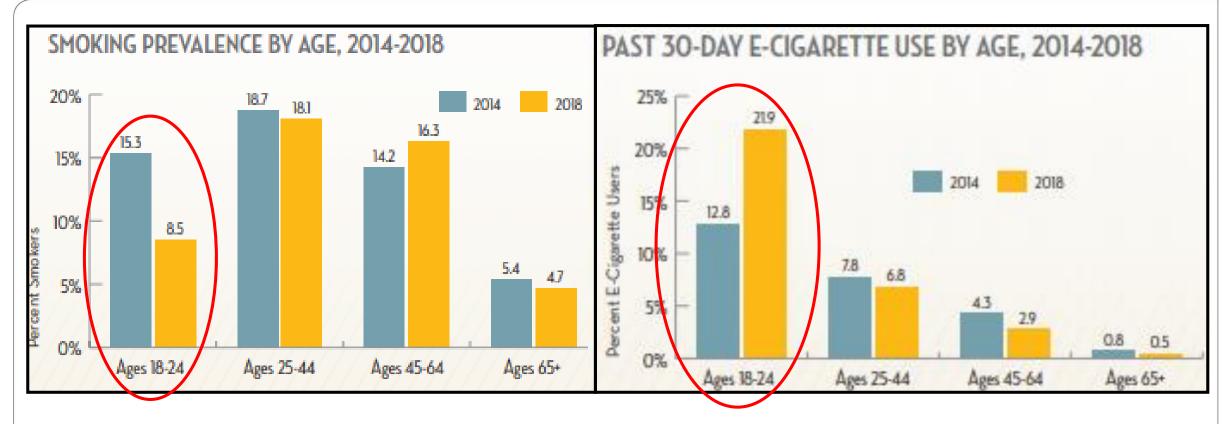

While young adult conventional smoking has dropped to an all-time low, the e-cig use has doubled since 2014.

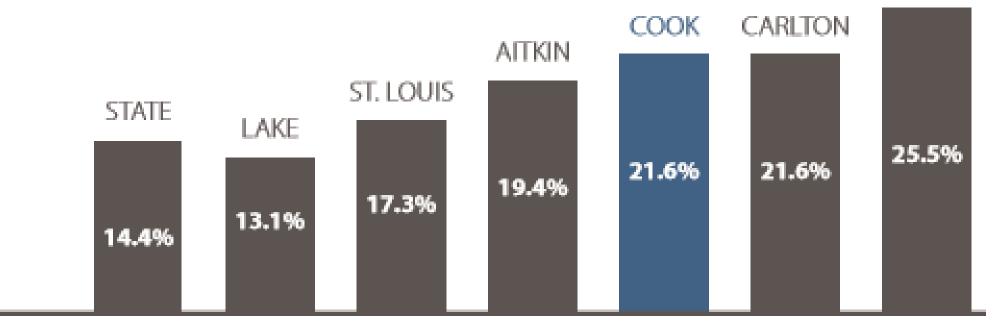

PERCENT OF ADULT TOBACCO USE COMPARED

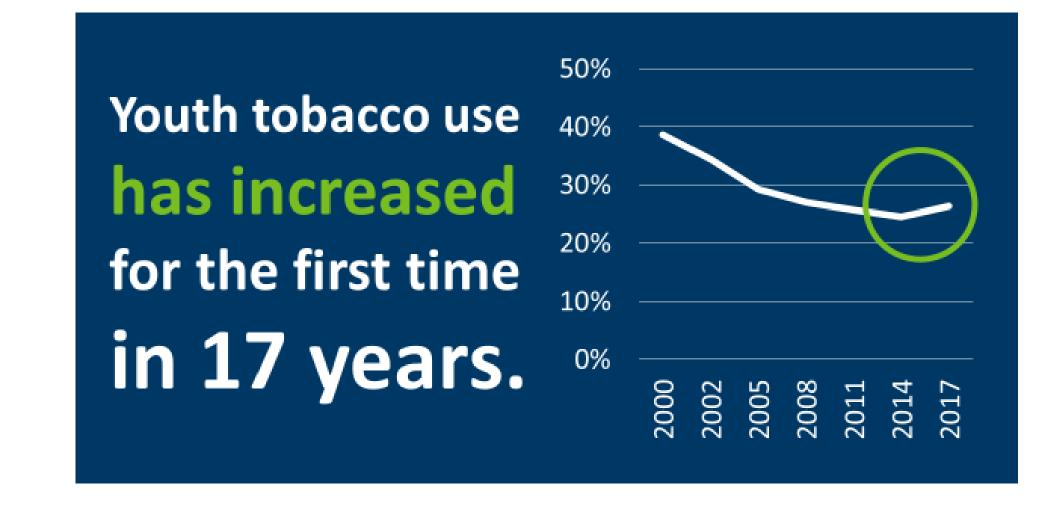

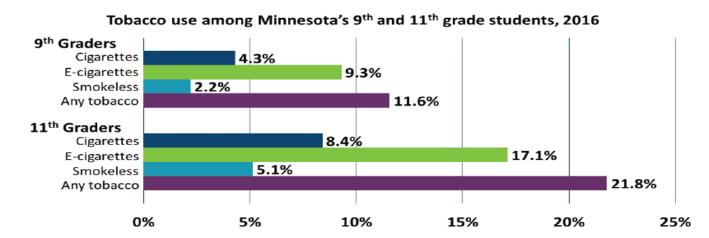

50% increase since 2014.

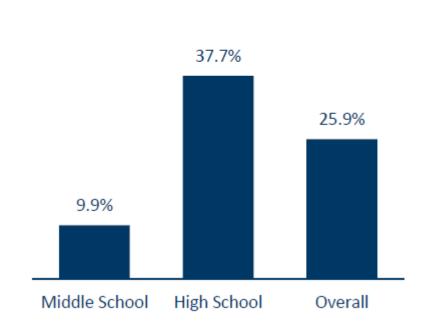

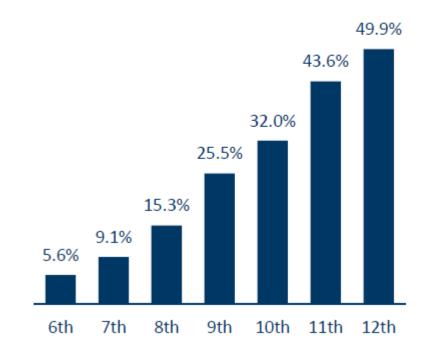

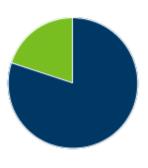

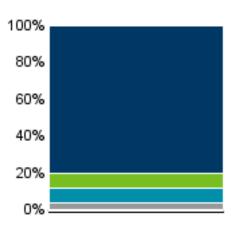

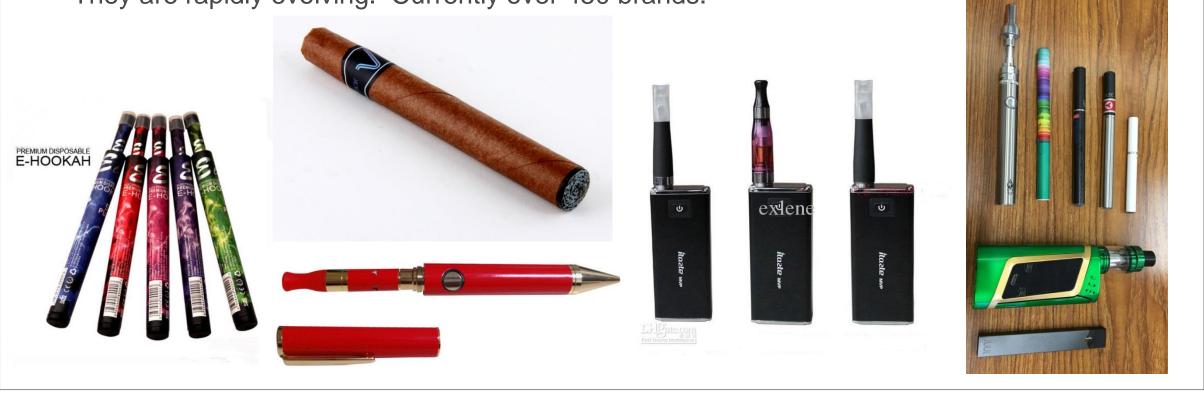

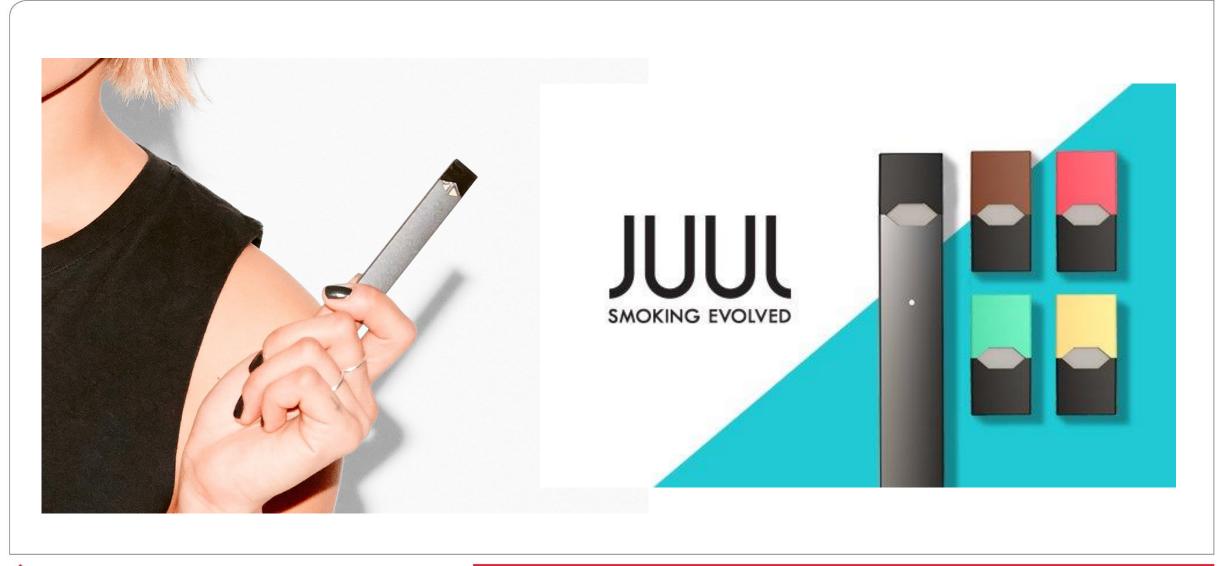

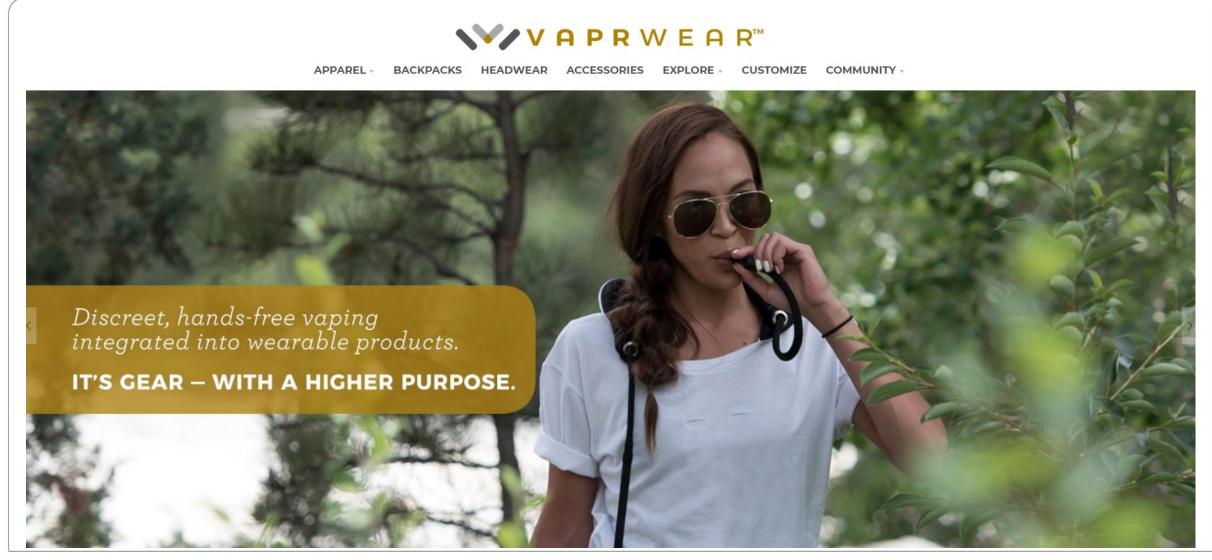

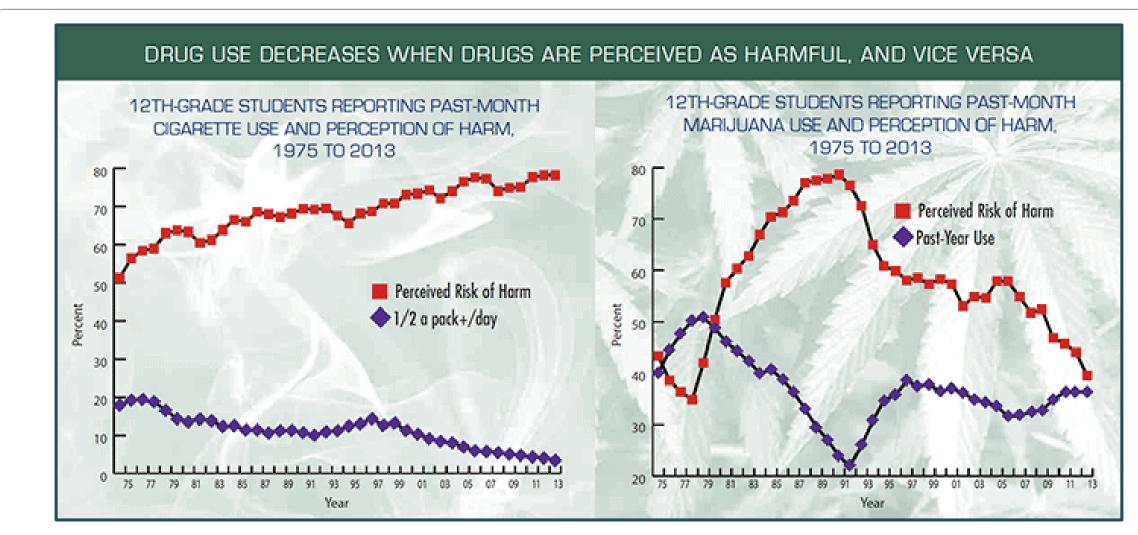

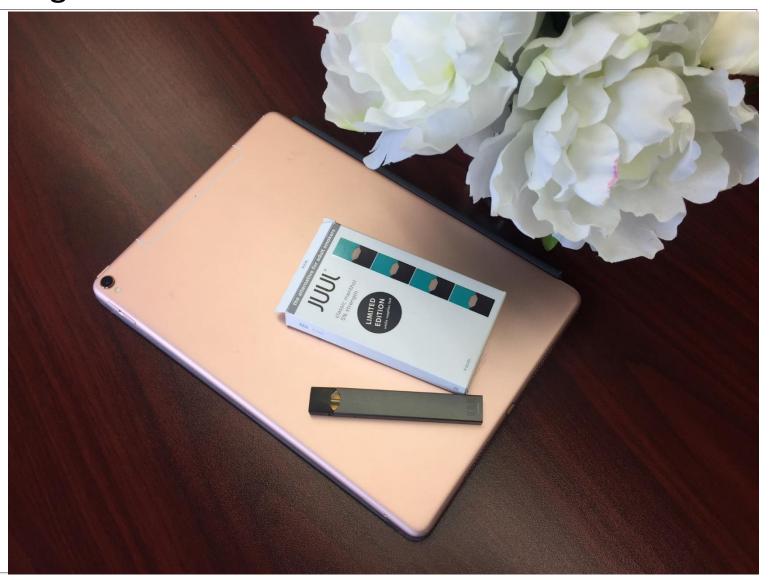


No amount is safe for youth.

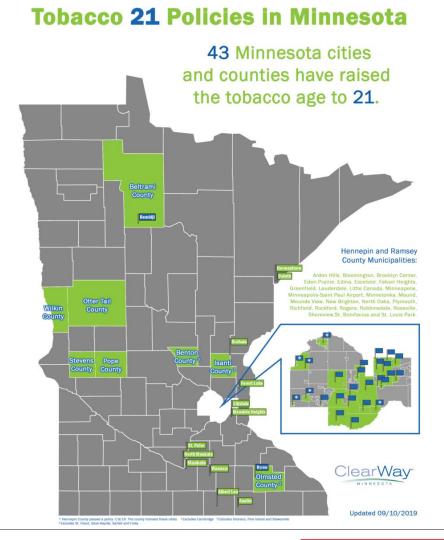
T21 is Gaining Traction
