## For Taxing Short-Term Rental Cabins and Condos

#### **NEW INTERPRETATION OF TAX LAW COULD DAMAGE TOURISM**

In Minnesota, similar types of cabins and condos that are occasionally rented to others during vacations are being **classified three different ways** depending on the county – seasonal recreational, residential non-homestead or commercial.

Last year, the Minnesota Department of Revenue advised county assessors to begin taxing vacation homes that are shared with renters as commercial businesses.

If implemented, this would devastate local economies across Greater Minnesota that depend on tourism. This new interpretation will:

- <u>Double or even triple taxes</u> on individual cabin and condo owners who sometimes rent their property
- Force owners of short-term rental property to quit renting or sell
- Depress real estate values at tourist destinations
- Jeopardize jobs and local businesses

# **SOLUTION:** FAIR TAX RATE PRESERVES OUR QUALITY OF LIFE

It's fair to ask cabin and condo owners to pay a little more in property taxes if they receive rental

income, but we should be consistent and we shouldn't tax them as if they were a full-time business, either.

We are advocating legislation that

would create a new tax class for short-term rental properties that would tax them at a similar rate as long-term rental.

Under this bill, the tax rate for short-term rental cabins and condos will be 1.25. The properties would also be taxable for referendum market value levies for local schools. **Learn more about our proposal**:

- More options for lodging attract more tourists to support local economies








#### **ECONOMIC IMPACT**
