Greetings Cook County School Families!

Happy March! I hope this finds you healthy and that you are enjoying the warmer weather.

We are looking forward to having our student body PK-12 in our building starting on March 9th. Our middle school will be starting on March 2nd and our high school on March 9th. Please be sure to check out the Hybrid plans on our website, Cookcountyschools.org.

- All students will participate in distance learning on Mondays with teachers meeting with their classes, individual check-ins, and independent work. Students will not follow the 4 block schedule on Mondays.
- Students in 6th-8th grade will start attending school in their classrooms Tuesdays through Fridays from 8:00-2:15. The earliest students should be in the building is 7:45 a.m. when our door monitors are there to greet them.
- When a student arrives at school they will travel directly to get breakfast, then to their locker. and then to their Homeroom classroom.
- There will be **no congregating** in the hallways.
- Each of our 9th-12th grade classrooms are large enough for the full class to attend as student numbers are less than the 50% capacity and maintain social distance.
- Each classroom will have a seating chart for students to be socially distanced.
- Students will have lockers to keep their personal belongings in when they arrive and pick up before they depart for the day.
- Students will not visit lockers between classes.
- Lunch will be provided in the lunch room where students will have assigned seats, physical barriers and social distance to prevent transmission. Those students that bring a cold lunch will be allowed to retrieve their lunch from their locker on their way to the lunchroom.
- Buses will have assigned seats and there will be attendance taken on each route.

As a school we are here to support you as much as we can. If you need assistance with food, clothing, counseling services or being connected with assistance programs through the county. please do not hesitate to reach out to us - we are here to help.

Noticias de la Clase de Español News from Spanish class

¡Saludos (greetings)! I wanted to take a moment to share some fascinating topics Spanish 3 and AP students dove into for their final projects of first semester. I asked students to research a cultural tradition, culinary dish, historical figure or event from the Spanish speaking world. Students could choose to present their research in a number of ways. The creativity and variety of topics chosen was both inspiring and such a reflection of the diverse cultures that exist within Latin America and Spain.

- Students demonstrated how to make tres leches cake, pan tumaca, pico de gallo, carne asada, pandebono, huevos rancheros, and totopos y queso. Recipes originated from Spain, Colombia, Puerto Rico, and Mexico. Students chose to present their work in a variety of ways, from illustrating a recipe zine to filming episodes of original cooking shows!
- The Raramurí (Tarahumara) indigeneous people from Chihuahua, Mexico. These pueblos indígenas are well known for barefoot long distance running and their history of resisting Spanish colonization.
- A PBS Masterpiece Theater filmed discussion of the telenovela, "Amar y Vivir," complete with costumes.
- Spanish dictator Francisco Franco and the Spanish Civil War.
- An in-depth look at the symbolism of the Puerto Rican flag.
- Francisco Goya, Spanish painter and printmaker from the Romantic Period.
- Popular music from Latin America: reggaeton, trap, rock, and pop latino.

I'll close by saying gracias to my students who really "turned it up to eleven" for the end of first semester. ¡Excelente trabajo!



Throughout the pandemic, the Cook County Safe Routes to School Committee continues to work toward it's mission of: "Where it is safe, get kids walking and biking. Where it is not safe, make changes." The newest Safe Routes to School Plan, updated in 2020, can be found on your school's website. In order to support a safe environment for all students during the pandemic, there are no organized walk or bike to school events at this time. We encourage students to get out walking and biking as much as possible! In collaboration with the Community Center, we have designated the Community Center parking lot as the official "park and walk" site for Grand Marais. This is an easy location to park and walk with your student, or drop them off to walk to school without having to cross any major intersections. We hope to revive the weekly walk to school group, Walk and Roll Wednesdays, in a safe manner this spring. It is also our hope that in-school bike education for 3rd graders will be held this year, as well as the annual bike safety rodeo. We will continue to work diligently with the schools to provide these educational activities in a safe manner. The largest initiative we are presently working on is improving our SRTS bike fleet. We will be adding adaptive bikes, shorter stature bikes, balance bikes, new helmets, and a trailer to house and transport the fleet to other school districts and youth education activities within our county. We are excited to showcase the updated fleet this spring, when all of the components have come together! 
