Guidelines:

Collage should in some way reflect nature, the outdoors, or your Earth Day celebrations.

Any media or form is accepted. This may include, but is not limited to, paint, chalk, pencil, ink, photography, natural materials/items found in nature, or written art.

When possible, return any collected items back to nature where you found them. Leave No Trace.
