Tips to keep your tree fresh this holiday season

Christmas trees are often the piece de resistance of holiday decor. Few things draw the attention of holiday guests quite like an awe-in-

spiring Christmas tree, especially when that tree maintains its fresh, healthy sheen throughout December. Many families purchase

fresh trees over Thanksgiving weekend or during the first weekend of December. Though the weeks between Thanksgiving and Christmas

Day may seem like a long time to keep a tree looking great, there are a handful of ways for holiday celebrants to help their trees maintain that undeniable appeal for the long haul.

•Pick the right tree. Choosing the right tree is one of the simplest ways to keep a tree looking good throughout the holiday season. A freshly cut tree that buyers choose and cut down themselves or have cut down can reassure them that the tree is likely to stay strong throughout December. Trees purchased from a tree lot may have been cut down long before they made it to the lot, which can make it harder to keep them looking good until Christmas Day.

•Cut an inch off the base of any tree that is not freshly cut. MSU Extension at Michigan State University notes that all Christmas trees are conifers, which means they have resin canals in their trunks. Once a tree is cut, the resin can block the

pores and make it harder for the tree to take in water. Cutting an inch off the base of a tree that was not freshly cut just before putting it in the stand can help ensure it gets the water it needs to stay healthy and firm. MSU Extension notes that this approach should be taken with any tree that was not cut within six to eight hours of being put in a stand.

•Replenish the water supply every day. Fresh tree veterans recognize that Christmas trees can be very thirsty, especially within the first week or so of being cut and brought home. Fill the stand with water each morning and, if necessary, refill it each night before going to bed. The more water a tree gets and drinks, the more likely it is that the

tree will look healthy all the way to Christmas Day. MSU Extension notes that many decorative or antique tree stands do not hold much water, so anyone with such a stand may need to replenish the water supply more than once or twice per day. •Keep the tree away from a heat source. For safety's sake, trees should be kept away from heating vents, fireplaces and space heaters. But keeping trees away from such heat sources, and ensuring they are not spending the daytime in direct sunlight, also decreases the chances they will dry out before Christmas Day.

A handful of simple strategies can help holiday celebrants keep their Christmas trees looking good throughout the month of December.

FAMILY HOLIDAY RECIPE

Glazed Lemon Cake

Cake:
1/2 lb. (2 sticks) sweet butter, softened
2 cups granulated sugar
3 eggs
3 cups unbleached, all-purpose flour, sifted
1/2 tsp. baking soda
1/2 tsp. salt
1 cup buttermilk
2 tightly packed tbsp. grated lemon zest
2 tbsp fresh lemon juice
Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Grease a 10-inch tube pan

Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in eggs, one at a time, blending well after each addition.

Sift together flour, baking soda and salt. Stir dry ingredients into egg mixture alternately with buttermilk, beginning and ending with dry ingredients. Add lemon zest and juice.

Pour batter into prepared tube pan. Set on the



middle rack of the oven and bake for 1 hour and 5 minutes, or until cake pulls away from sides of pan and a tester inserted in the center comes out clean.

Cool cake in the pan, set on a rack, for 10 minutes. Remove cake from pan and spread on icing at once, while cake is still hot.

Lemon Icing:
1 lb. confectioner's sugar
8 tbsp. (1 stick) sweet butter, softened
3 tightly packed tbsp. grated lemon zest
1/2 cup fresh lemon juice

Cream sugar and butter thoroughly. Mix in lemon zest and juice, spread on warm cake.

Looking forward to cozying up with some great new books this winter? Not to worry, as there are plenty to go around. You just may have a difficult time choosing! Here are a few suggestions to get you started.

Who doesn't love the story of The Nutcracker this time of year? For the newly initiated, there is **A Child's Introduction to the Nutcracker: The Story, Music, Costumes and Choreography of the Fairy Tale Ballet**, a lovely book written by Heather Alexander and illustrated by Amelie Videlo. Though intended for ages 8-12, ballet enthusiasts of all ages will delight in the magical story and the magnificent ballet it inspired in this enchanted book packed with colorful illustrations,

Festive apps to satisfy guests

Christmas is a food lover's paradise. Even though the meal and side dishes are the crowning achievements on Christmas, hungry guests will need something to tide them over until the piece de r'sistance is ready. In such situations, bite-sized appetizers that are tasty yet not too filling can fit the bill.

Charcuterie boards and tasting menus continue to be all the rage. In addition to a platter of fruit slices, figs, aged cheeses and crostini, treat guests to 'Mini

Cheese Ball Bites,' which offer various textures and flavors in bite-sized morsels. Enjoy this recipe, courtesy of 'Spectacular Spreads: 50 Amazing Food Spreads for Any Occasion' (Rock Point) by Meagan Brown.

Mini Cheese Ball Bites

Makes 12

- 8 ounces light cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup shredded sharp cheddar cheese
- 3 tablespoons drained, chopped pimentos
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder

- 1 teaspoon paprika
- Pinch kosher salt
- Pinch freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 cup crushed pecans
- 1/4 cup chopped chives
- 12 pretzel sticks

In a large bowl, stir together the cream cheese, cheddar, pimentos, garlic powder, paprika, salt, and pepper until well combined. Cover and refrigerate for at least 30 minutes. Place the crushed pecans and chives in a small bowl. Set aside.



Roll the cheese mixture into twelve 1-inch balls. Evenly coat each ball with the pecan-chive mixture. Press a pretzel stick into the top of each cheese ball just before serving. Serve at room temperature or chilled.

Italian Cookies

- Cookies:
- 3 eggs
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 1/2 tsp. anise or lemon extract
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 1/2 tsp. baking soda
- 1 1/2 tsp. baking powder
- Pinch of salt
- 3 1/2 - 4 cups flour
- 3/4 cup milk

- Icing:
- 2 cups sifter confectioners' sugar
- 1/2 tsp. of flavoring (anise or lemon)
- 2 tbs. water

Beat eggs well, add the rest of ingredients and beat well again. Add 3 1/2 - 4



cups of flour, adding the last cup gradually to form a rather stiff cookie dough. Line cookie sheets with parchment paper and drop dough by tablespoons to form long loaves to a cookie sheet. Bake at 400 for about 15 minutes. Frost with confectioners' sugar icing flavored with lemon or anise. Cut into slices when cool.

Shopping local to bolster the community

More money stays in the community. Approximately 68% of every \$100 spent at local businesses will be reinvested back into the community. That money goes towards better schools, libraries, social services, and beautification projects.

Small businesses give back to their communities. Small business owners sponsor Little League teams, donate to community charities, and host fundraising events for area causes—making a direct impact on a community's quality of life.

Job creation is fueled by small businesses. Local es-



tablishments tend to hire within the community. By patronizing Main Street shops and non-chain restaurants, consumers can help these businesses grow and thrive, creating even more jobs.

Small businesses carry unique products and gifts. Small businesses often carry items that consumers cannot find anywhere else. From handmade candles and jewelry to artwork and small clothing lines, local stores tend to stock products that are not mass-produced, helping area craftspeople and artists make a living, resulting in a more diverse, interesting community.

Small businesses support the American Dream. Shopping small helps local entrepreneurs achieve the American Dream, the belief that anyone, no matter his or her background, can at-

tain success and upward mobility through hard work

and perseverance.

While big retailers and chains are also part of many communities, it's the small businesses that truly make towns and cities unique. Independent restaurants and shops add character and interest and help create a sense of place.

A guide to picking the perfect fresh Christmas tree

Come the holiday season, perhaps no tradition evokes the warm and fuzzy 'feels' more than a family outing to pick a Christmas tree. Whether it's a trek to a live Christmas tree farm or a short drive to the nearest pre-cut tree lot, the process of selecting a tree that will serve as the crown jewel

of the entire season is a great way to make lasting memories. Selecting a tree is a yearly ritual and each person has his or her set of criteria for what makes the ideal Christmas tree. These tips can help families find the right tree.

Choose your species

Do some homework on the

type of tree you want prior to buying the tree. Balsam fir and fraser fir are popular Christmas tree varieties, but there are many others, such as noble fir and Norway spruce. Balsams are known for having the most fragrant smell, but frasers tend to keep their needles the longest. For those who prefer

a douglas fir, keep in mind that they sometimes drop their needles prematurely due to foliar diseases like needle-cast fungus.

Space for ornaments

In addition to aroma and needle longevity, look for trees that have a desirable shape and allow for adequate space between



branches, advises the home and garden resource The Spruce. Trees groomed to be lush and full will look beautiful unadorned, but once ornaments are added, full branches may cause those ornaments to hang low or even fall off. Trees with sparse branches allow for ornaments to hang straight.

Measure your space

Trees in the field or in a lot may look much smaller than they do when brought into the living room. Don't make the mistake of selecting a tree that is too large for your home. The agricultural firm Ragan & Masey says to measure the room from floor to ceiling and subtract the height of the tree stand and tree topper. It's equally important to measure the width of the area where the tree will stand and allow for ample space for foot traffic around the tree.

Perform a needle check

Every tree will drop some needles, and most evergreens hold their foliage. Modest needle loss is not an indicator of a poor tree. However, Decker's Nursery in Greenlawn, NY says if 50 percent of the needles are lost when you swipe your hand down three to five different branches around the tree, the tree likely is not a good choice. In addition, avoid a tree that has glaring defects in the trunk as it can impede water flow through the tree.

Heavier is better

A heavy pre-cut tree means it is full of water and has been cut more recently. A healthy, fresh tree is going to require an effort to lift. Older, dried out trees will not be heavy. Upon arriving home, make a fresh cut off the tree trunk and get it in water as soon as possible even if that's a bucket until the tree stand can be set up.

Day After Turkey Divan

1-10 oz. package of frozen broccoli or asparagus spears, cooked and drained
 4 large slices of Turkey
 1 can of condensed cream of vegetable, celery, chicken or mushroom soup
 1/3 cup milk
 1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese
 Arrange broccoli or asparagus in shallow baking dish. Top with turkey slices. Blend soup and milk; pour over turkey; sprinkle with cheese. Bake at 450 until sauce is slightly browned - about 15 minutes.

Latkes

1 lb. potatoes
 1/2 cup onion, finely chopped
 1 egg, slightly beaten
 1/4 tsp. salt
 1/2 cup olive oil
 sour cream & apple sauce for serving
 Peel and grate potatoes. Mix with onion, egg and salt in a bowl. Heat oil in frying pan. Fry latkes in 1 tbs. lumps for 3-5 minutes each side. Keep overnight in fridge, reheat 5 minutes in 375-degree oven when ready to eat.

Maple Sweet Potato Casserole

adapted from Cook's Illustrated
 3 lbs. (about 6 medium) sweet potatoes, peeled,

halved lengthwise, and halves cut cross-wise into 1/4-inch slices
 6 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted
 5 tablespoons maple syrup
 1 tablespoon grated fresh ginger or 1 teaspoon powdered
 3/4 teaspoon salt
 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
 1-1/2 tablespoons cornstarch

Adjust oven rack to middle position and heat oven to 375 degrees. In large pot or Dutch oven of boiling water, parboil sweet potato slices over high heat until they are bright orange and the point of a paring knife easily pierces but does not break apart a few slices, 4 to 5 minutes. Drain potatoes well and turn into buttered 13 x 9-inch baking dish. Whisk melted butter, maple syrup, ginger, salt, and cayenne in small bowl; set aside. Mix cornstarch with 2 tablespoons cold water in small bowl until totally smooth, then whisk into butter mixture; pour over sweet potatoes and toss to coat well.

Cover dish tightly with foil and bake until liquid is bubbly, about 50 minutes. Remove foil, stir potatoes gently, and bake until liquid thickens to glaze potatoes, about 20 minutes longer. Cool slightly and serve hot or at room temperature.

Potato Casserole

5 lbs. of potatoes, mashed with milk and butter
 1/2 pint of sour cream
 4 oz. cream cheese
 1 tsp. onion salt
 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
 Parsley, optional, for garnish
 Mix all ingredients and place in greased casserole dish. Bake uncovered for 1 hour at 350. Can be made the day before and reheated.

Yum Yums

An annual Christmas Treat
 1 package of dates, chopped (approx. 1-1/2 - 2 cups)
 1 cup sugar
 2 cups crispy rice cereal
 1 egg
 1/2 cup glaze cherries (candied cherries)
 1/4 lb. butter
 1/2-1 cup desiccated coconut
 1/2 cup chopped nuts
 Melt butter and stir in dates and sugar. Beat the egg and stir in. Cook on low heat for 10 minutes - until dates are soft. Add nuts and stir in rice cereal and cherries. Let cool for approximately 15 minutes. Form into balls and roll in coconut. Refrigerate or freeze until served. Makes approximately 4 dozen.



Great Grandmother's Christmas Fruitcake

- 3-4-ounce jars glazed mixed fruit with peels
- 3-4-ounce jars glazed pine-apples, cubed
- 2-3 1/2-ounce glazed cher-ries, slivered
- 3 3/4 cups seedless golden raisins
- 3/4 cup currants
- 2 1/4 cups chopped pe-cans or walnuts
- 1/2 cup grape juice
- 2 cups brown sugar
- 1/2 lb. butter, softened
- 5 eggs
- 1 tsp. almond extract
- 2 cups sifted all-purpose flour
- 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. mace spice
- 1/2 tsp. baking soda
- Brandy - enough to soak cheese cloth

Mix sugar and butter thoroughly in large mixing bowl. Beat eggs and ex-tract into mixture. Sift flour, spices and baking soda together. Add dry ingredi-ents to sugar mixture and blend well. Mix batter into first mixture thoroughly.

Turn batter into 10-inch tube pan. Level with wax paper, pressing lightly.

Bake in oven at 275 de-grees until firm and evenly browned (about three hours and 20 minutes). Re-move from oven, cool for 1/2 hour. Turn out onto cool-ing rack. Cool thoroughly. Wrap cake in brandy-soaked cheesecloth. Store in an air-tight container for one week. Chill overnight before serving.

Did you know?

Lights on a Christmas tree may seem like a relatively re-cent phenomenon, but people who can't wait to deck the halls each December may be surprised to learn that this beloved tradition dates all the way back to the late nineteenth century. Edward Johnson, a friend and col-league of Thomas Edison, introduced holiday light bulbs in 1882. Prior to that, candles were lit on trees and families would briefly gaze at this awe-inspiring bit of holiday de-cor before the candles were quickly extinguished. John-son is credited with being the first to suggest light bulbs, which were invented by his friend Edison, be used to light trees in place of candles. While many were impressed by Johnson's eight-bulb holiday display, it remained a novelty until the 1920s, when preassembled lights became more accessible. Since then, Christmas tree lights have taken hold as a must-have piece of holiday decor in households across the globe.


