



Get artsy at Maltz Museum's new special exhibit

Chagall for Children: Where Kids Can Touch The Art

The Maltz Museum of Jewish Heritage announces the highly anticipated Cleveland premiere of Chagall for Children, which explores the work of one of the best-known and most-loved artists of the 20th century, Marc Chagall. Handson and interactive, 14 multi-sensory exploration stations have been designed to specifically engage children ages 2-12. Each station features a high-quality reproduction of one of Marc Chagall's works and encourages exploration of art principles such as color, composition, light, and texture.

Chagall for Children is a unique exhibition created by Kohl Children's Museum and features over a dozen Chagall masterpieces, all accompanied by hands-on interactive elements that allow children to express their own creativity. "Chagall was such a whimsical artist," said KCM President & CEO Sheridan Turner. "Young children immediately pick up on the fanciful and unusual aspects of his work. He really appeals to children's senses of wonder and fantasy."

Each piece of artwork includes an audio recording that gives guests information about the piece. After learning some background information about the work, they can take part in a hands-on activity related to the artwork.

These imaginative activities are as varied as Chagall's works. For example, a fabric rendition of Chagall's "The Rooster" lets children rearrange the bird's colorful tail feathers. A bas-relief of "The Birthday" allows guests to make rubbings of the artwork to take home. "The Poultry Yard" offers various soft-sculpture animal parts that children can mix and match to create their own fantastical animals.

At different stations throughout the exhibition, guests can create mosaics, weave tapestries, use touch screens to digitally alter Chagall's masterpieces, conduct symphonies, and—through the magic of video-even insert themselves into one his paintings. After these hands-on experiences, guests can curl up in a reading nook stocked with children's books about Chagall's life and work.

Hours & pricing: Visitors can explore the Chagall for Children exhibition at the Maltz Museum, Tuesday through Sunday, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. through timed ticketing which must be purchased in advance at www.maltzmuseum.org or by phone at 216-593-0575. General: \$12, students & seniors: \$10, children 5-11: \$5, children under 5 and Maltz Museum members are free.

Public Programs: This summer, to accompany the special exhibition, the Maltz Museum will be hosting unique programming for all ages. Monthly family-fun programs on Sundays, will cost just \$5 per person. Plus, guests can join the Maltz Museum and its partners for a weekly storytime





Make sure your summer isn't a bummer – insure your fun!

Summer is here and it's time to put the boat on the lake or get the ATV's out of storage, so now is a great time to check with your insurance agent to make sure your summer fun items are properly protected. Here are some tips on reviewing your coverage, and some questions to ask your agent, to make sure you and your family are insured for the increased risks that come with those fun outdoor activities.

Boats

Small boats may be automatically covered by your homeowner's policy, but coverage is limited depending on the size of the boat and the motor. If you own a boat, ask your insurance agent about a boatowner's policy that covers physical damage to the boat and any liability that might result from its use.

Personal watercrafts, such as jet skis, will also require a separate insurance policy.

Questions to ask your agent before putting your boat or personal watercraft in the water:

- Does my policy have adequate liability limits?
- Are there special discounts for taking safety courses?
- Who does the policy cover to operate the boat or personal watercraft?
- Is the liability of towing skiers or persons on tubes covered by my policy?

Owning and operating a boat or jet ski puts you

at increased risk for liability losses. Consider adding a personal umbrella policy to provide liability coverage above what your boat policy offers. Talk to your agent about your options.

Rented Watercraft

One of the most common rental scenarios for watercraft involves jet skis. Despite their popularity, most standard homeowner's policies limit the liability coverage available for rented jet skis to those with 50 HP or less, so this limitation may exclude coverage for many, if not most, rented jet skis. Most nonmotorized watercraft such as kayaks, rafts, canoes, and rowboats should be covered, but it's always best to check with your agent prior to renting. Carefully read all rental agreements to make sure you know exactly what you'll be liable for.

ATVs

All-terrain vehicles (ATVs) are also not covered by standard automobile policies; however, your homeowner's policy might partially cover your liability on an ATV. You should consider a separate ATV policy to make sure you are properly insured.

Pools

Be sure to ask if your homeowner's policy specifies any safety guidelines you are required to follow, such as installing a certain height fence or locked gate for example. An insurance company can deny coverage or cancel your policy if you do not follow the safety guidelines or do not inform the company when you install a pool.

Having a pool puts you at increased risk for liability losses. You may also want to consider purchasing an umbrella policy to provide liability coverage above what your homeowner's policy offers.

Greater Cleveland Aquarium celebrates 10 years of educating & entertaining families

Greater Cleveland Aquarium first opened its doors in January of 2012. Today the Aquarium is home to 3,600 animals representing 250 fresh and saltwater species, including some rare weedy seadragon hatchlings.

"The weedy seadragon birth is a major accomplishment and we're excited to document and share what we learn from the process with others focused on the care and conservation of this delicate species," says curator Ray Popik.

Exhibit design has everything to do with the Aquarium's success—both rearing seadragons and in terms of the destination's unique appeal—but retrofitting a historic brick powerhouse for an aquarium was not without its challenges, explains Mike Gorek, senior maintenance technician and exhibit diver. "Finding opportunities in the limitations and figuring out how to create viable, one-of-a-kind habitats from scratch is a fun and rewarding part of my job." Guests who have not visited the Aquarium since it opened will discover that all of its galleries have been re-themed to be immersive.

Species diversity, immersive décor, child's eye-level exhibits and 360-degree views have solidified the downtown Cleveland attraction as a family-friendly tourist destination and contributed to the growing vibrancy of the community, asserts Neda Spears, office assistant. When Spears began as an aquarium guest experience associate back in 2012, there wasn't nearly as much activity in The Flats and the adjacent Gordon Square, Hingetown and Ohio City neighborhoods. "Now there are any number of terrific eateries, breweries, shops, performance venues



and trails for our team, guests and 15,000 passholders to enjoy."

Halle Minshall, dive safety coordinator, heads up a team of scuba divers responsible for underwater cleaning, husbandry maintenance and guest engagement. She loves seeing visitors connect with the aquatic world. "We encourage everyone to consider how their actions can impact waterways and the natural habitats of some pretty amazing animals," says Minshall. "I hope some guests are inspired to learn more about biology and marine science—and maybe even learn to scuba dive!"



Safe & smart recycling, summer collection season

New permanent drop-off site and special collection days available

The Lake County Solid Waste District has partnered with the Department of Utilities to repurpose an area at the Landfill and Recycling Center in Painesville Twp. into a drop-off site. This repurposed location is at 2039 Blase Nemeth Rd. in Painesville Twp. and will be a one-stop-shop allowing residents to bring recyclable items and household waste materials to one location, in one trip.

This change also brings welcomed improvements like expanded hours and days, the added convenience of credit card payments, and expanded space for trailers to be utilized for hauling multiple items to the facility.

This permanent recycling drop-off area will be open to residents from June 6 through August 31 during the landfill's standard business hours of Monday through Friday 7 am to 3:30 pm and Saturdays 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. Residents will be required to enter through the scale house entrance where they can pay with cash, check, and credit card for any fees associated with this drop-off. Please be advised, that materials in an open truck bed or open trailer need to be tarped during transportation to the drop-off to be accepted.

Residents will unload their recyclable items and take them into the building to be stacked and sorted by our team. Accepted items include appliances, household electronics, computer-related devices, monitors, televisions, and tires. Residents can be assured all memory components on computer-related devices will be professionally erased or destroyed in a secure facility prior to being recycled. Residents may bring up to six tires per day only.

The fees associated with this dropoff are as follows:

- No cost/free: most corded and rechargeable household electronics including phones, computers, towers, and printers.
- \$3 each: car and pickup truck tires – no rims, six max. per day, up to 20".
- \$5 each: household appliances,



flat screens/tube screens 27" and smaller, and semi-truck tires - no rims, six max. per day, over 20".

- \$10 each: flat/tube screens larger than 27", projection & console sets.
- \$15 each: tractor and agricultural tires, no rims, six max per day.

For the time being, and due to an abundance of caution, the Household Hazardous Waste Collection events will remain at the Lake County Fairgrounds and are scheduled for June 11 and September 24 from 8 am-2 pm. There are no fees associated with this collection. Keeping substances in their original containers or marking them, if possible, is recommended to shorten the processing times. At the event, the collection team will unload your vehicle. The Lake County Fairgrounds is located at 1301 Mentor Ave., Painesville Twp., enter only from Mentor Ave.

Hazardous waste accepted at this event includes most automotive, household cleaners, lawn, pool, and unknown chemicals. Bulbs and batteries. Aerosols, empty propane tanks, kerosene, mercury, paints (oilbased), polyurethanes, primers, and grout. Roofing tars, shellacs, stains, thinners, turpentine, and varnish.

The following items are prohibited at the collection event and at the Landfill and Recycling Center: Ammunition, explosives, latex paint (dry it & toss it), medical waste, prescription medicines, and smoke alarms (mail to manufacturer).




